



Synopsis of Land Act Amendments

Minimum price of first-class land reduced to \$6 an acre; second-class to 11.14 AD ACTO. Pre-emption new confined to su veyed lands only.

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is non-timber land. Partnership pre-emptions aboltshed, but parties of not more than four may with joint residence, but each making necessary improvements on respective

Pre-emptore must occupy claims for five years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clear-ing and cultivation of at least 5 acres. before receiving Crown Grant. Where pre-emptor in occupation no less than I years, and has made proportionate improvements, he may, begranted intermediate certificate of improvement and transfer his claim.

Records without permanent restdence may be issued, provided applicant makes improvements to extent or \$200 per annum and records same each year. Failure to make improvements or record same will operate as forfeiture. Title cannot be obtained in less than 6 years, and improvements of \$10.00 per acre, including 5 acres cleared and cultivated, and residence of at least 2 years are required. Pre-emptor holding Crown grant may record another pre-emption, if he farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted land.

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesites; title to be obtained after fulfilling resi-For grazing and industrial purposes areas exceeding 640 acres may be Mill, factory or industrial sites on timber land not exceeding 40 acres may be purchased; conditions include payment of stumpage. Natural hay meadows insocessible by existing roads may be purchased

conditional upon construction of a road to them. Rebate of one-half of cost of road, not exceeding half of purchaprice, is made. PRE-EMPTORS' FREE GRANTS

The scope of this Act is enlarged to include all persons joining and serving with His Majesty's Forces. The time within which the heirs or devisees of a deceased pre-emptor may appl for title under this Act is extended from for one year from the death of such person, as formerly, until one year after the conclusion of the present war. This privilege is also made re-

No fees relating to pre-emptions are due or payable by soldiers on pre-emptions recorded after June 26, 1918. Taxes are remitted for five years. Provision for return of moneys accrued, due and been paid since August 6, 1914, on account of payments, fees or taxes on soldiers' pre-emptions. Interest on agreements to purchase town or city lots held by members of Allied Forces, or dependents, acquired direct or indirect, remitted from en-

SUB-PURCHASERS OF CROWN Provision made for issuance Crown grants to sub-purchasers of Crown Lands, acquiring rights from purchasers who failed to complete purchase, involving forfeiture, on ful-fillment of conditions of purchase, iners do not claim whole of original parcel, purchase price due and taxes may be distributed proportionately over whole area. Applications must be made by May 1, 1920.
