Mining News

Operations on the Bayview, at the top of the hill back of Stewart, are to begin at once. Camp was established at the property last week. Work on the trail which required considerable blasting has been going on for the past few weeks. The Bayview was bonded last fall by Will and George Cameron to R. H. Thompson of Everett, Wash. Some very high assays in silver have been returned from ore in narrow veins exposed on the property. Assays were taken from a new vein in the progress of assessment the other day and they showed up fine. J. L. Stamford of Victoria has planned great development work this season.

The Silver Crest on Salmon River is looking good for the amount of work that has been done. A force of twenty-one men is now employed. This is the first season in which development has been undertaken. E. W. McQuade is in charge, but operations are under the direction of P. W. Racey, a mining engineer of Vancouver.

The Premier Mine on Salmon River is employing more than one hundred and fifty men in and about the mine. Good progress is being made with the concentrator foundations and the pipe line. More men will be needed in the near future and are being put to work as they arrive in town.

One of the two big diamond drills on the Big Missouri mine at Stewart has been closed down. All results have been very satisfactory, it is understood, but the costs of operation are running rather high. The drill which is on the E Pluribus claim still continues. High grade ore is being opened up here.

The Algimian Development Co. of Belgium is doing a lot of thorough work on the Northern and Spider groups on Salmon River and on the Fitzgerald group on Bear River. The operations of this company as carried out in the Stewart district are next largest to the Premier.

Operations on a small scale are being carried out at various claims along the Salmon, Bear, Marmot and Georgia Rivers. P. B. Backus and his associates are making preparations to operate in the Naas section back of Stewart.

This season there have been more prominent mining men in the Stewart district than there have been for a long time. With so much development work proceeding ore bodies of great potentiality are being exposed. However the prospectors are not losing any time and are getting their claims in condition for examination, so that the geologists and mining engineers can give the ground the once over and let the owner know to some degree how his prospect should shape out.

Messrs. Anderson and Krause recently arrived at Dawson reporting New gold strikes on Keno Hill, Mount Hinton and vicinity. The road to that locality is bad, however.

Prospecting work is to be undertaken at Lookout Mountain in the Mayo district, Yukon territory. The Government diamond drill has been secured and is thought to be now at work. The machine will be in charge of Messrs. Gaunt and McDougall.

In the July issue of the Western Canadian "Motorist," a motor magazine published at Vancouver, B.C., three excellent articles appear. Hon. Dr. J. H. King, minister of public works, outlines the proposed highways program as given at the address at New Westminster before a large audience composed of members of the New Westminster Automobile Club, Board of trade, Reeves of neighboring municipalities and representative citizens. A. E. Foreman outlines how the province will spend eight and a half million dollars during the next two or three years for improvement of highways. Another interesting article is entitled "Will British Columbia benefit from a change in the rule of the road?"
