## Community Work Featured By Order of Canadian Elks

Interesting addresses at Banquet given last night to head of organization throughout Canada.

The need of community work was emphasized in an address last night by Grand Exalted Ruler Joseph F. Morris at a banquet at which he was the guest of honor given by the local lodge. He told the members something of what the Canadian Elks were, what they had done, and what they proposed to do. Community work was a feature of Elksdom and he urged members of the local lodge to make themselves felt along these lines.

The banquet room, the K. of P. hall, was filled to overflowing with members and guests of the lodge. Dr. Maguire presided and at his left was the guest of the evening and Mayor McClymont while on the other side was the American Consul.

In speaking to the members, the Grand Exalted Ruler said that any good work to be done properly must be done by organized effort. The order was established in Canada as recently as 1912 at Vancouver, and was an outgrowth about it. Think what is behind it. The resources of the district were now asking for social affiliation. They had a Dominion charter and at present 48 lodges, of which at least 41 were in good condition and the others would be very soon. Elksdom in Canada had contributed 45 per cent of its members to the fighting forces of the Empire and one lodge had given 85 per cent and every officer of the order had been killed. Last year the order had increased 100 per cent and there were at present eleven lodges in British Columbia, every one of which was alive.

Mr. Morris told of his visit recently to various lodges throughout the country. At Kamloops they had 300 members and a fine home. At Winnipeg the new general manager of the Canadian National Railway here had been the Exalted Ruler.

### Big Order at Anyox.

Coming to the town of Anyox the speaker said they had a membership of 242 and there were sixteen applications in for membership. They expected to get 400 by the end of the year, and had prepared plans for a new home. At that place the Elks had endorsed the Navy League and had arranged to equip a number of the cadets with uniforms. It took British Columbia to show the right spirit, he said.

"Prince Rupert is a revelation to me," declared the official. "We don't half appreciate the wonderful things we have in Canada. The spirit of the Elks is needed to help develop the country. If I was mayor of a city as wonderful as Prince Rupert I should want to talk about it all night. It was a most pleasant surprise to me to come here and see it, especially after the tales I had heard."

### Purpose of Order.

Mr. Morris then explained that the purpose of the Elks was not chiefly social, but they set out to do community work. In Vancouver they had got behind a hospital drive and were one of the big factors in "putting it over." They looked after the children of the orphanage, the members of the home for incurables and did all kinds of public spirited work. Here he suggested there were plenty of opportunities for work of that kind.

At the conclusion of the address Mr. Morris was presented by the members with a handsome art hall lamp made by Morte Craig with views of Prince Rupert in the panels.

### Mayor McClymont.

In introducing the distinguished visitor, Mayor McClymont, said one could judge a city by its institutions. The Elks' lodge was one of the youngest but it was by no means the least. The Elks were the most enthusiastic body of men in the Dominion of Canada. Their success, however, depended on their rulers. If these men did not do their duties well, the organization went flat. The members too must support them, not only at banquets but at regular meetings. He wished the Elks every success, for he believed it was a great movement and that the city would benefit from their being here. He hoped the visitor would have both a pleasurable and profitable visit. The idea of non-sectarianism was one he particularly liked in the order.

### American Consul.

E. A. Wakefield, American consul, who spoke on "American Elks and the benefit of social affiliation," said it was impossible to sit at a board like that and not feel it was good to meet such people and associate with the leaders in the community. He mentioned the practical fraternity which characterized the members of the American order and which reached out and aided those in need. He told of the patriotic work done by Elks in the States.

The consul said he felt very much at home with the Elks here, as much as with those in his native town, Augusta, Maine. The condition through which the world was passing made calm patriotism needful for the future held many problems, with which it would be difficult to deal. An organization like theirs tended to stabilize conditions.

Mr. Wakefield said the League of Nations was one of the greatest ideas the mind of man ever conceived. He hoped they would agree to solve future problems without war. That must be the proper method of settling disputes either national or international.

The banquet provided was most enjoyable and there was music by the Westholme orchestra; several vocal quartettes by Messrs. Davie, Wilson, Clapperton and Lancaster; a violin solo by W. Balagno and songs by Frank Dibb and A. Fraser.

The gathering dispersed considerably after midnight, everyone speaking of the enjoyable time they had spent.
