### WATER NOTICE (USE AND STORAGE)

TAKE NOTICE that Taylor Mining Company, Limited, whose address is 602 Credit Pioneer Building, Vancouver, B. C., will apply for a license to take and use 30 cubic feet per second and to store 2,500 acre feet of water out of Clearwater Creek, a tributary of the Kitzault River, which flows westerly and drains into the Kitzault River about 25 miles north of Alice Arm, in the Province of British Columbia. The storage-dam will be located at the outlet of Clearwater Lake. The capacity of the reservoir to be created is about 2,500 acre feet, and it will flood about 200 acres of land. The water will be diverted from the stream at a point about the middle of Clearwater Lake. The exact position of which will be determined after survey, and will be used for power purposes upon the territory described as an area of 30 miles radius from the Wolf Group of Mineral Claims near the Kitzault River.

This notice was posted on the ground on the 29th day of June, 1920.

A copy of this notice and an application pursuant thereto and to the Water Act, 1914, will be filed at the office of the Water Recorder at Prince Rupert in the Province of British Columbia. Objections to the application or petition may be filed with the said Water Recorder or with the Controller of Water Rights, Parliament Buildings, Victoria, B. C., within thirty days after the first appearance of this notice in a local newspaper. The territory over which the power will be distributed is an area of 50 miles radius from the Wolf Group of Mineral Claims near the Kitzault River. The petition for the approval of the undertaking will be filed in the office of the Controller of Water Rights and with the Water Recorder at Prince Rupert aforesaid, and will be heard in the office of the Board of Investigation at a date to be fixed by the Controller of Water Rights, and any person interested may file an objection thereto in the office of the Controller of Water Rights or of the Water Recorder at Prince Rupert aforesaid.
