The lighthouse tender Newington left for seaward early this morning with Captain Bilton on the bridge and a full crew aboard.

The Canadian government steamer Stadacona sailed for the south at 6:45 last evening taking Hon. C. C. Ballantyne and family to Vancouver.

Mrs. J. G. Steen entertained at luncheon yesterday in honor of Mrs. A. E. Oakley, who is visiting here from Vancouver. Twelve ladies, old timers of Prince Rupert, were the invited guests.

Mr. and Mrs. James M. Hill are expected in the city next week. Mr. Hill will be the new United States vice-consul here in succession to David Donaldson, who has been transferred to Vancouver.

The Fox Film Corporation is in communication with the Agricultural Association regarding the sending of a movie man here for fair week. No definite arrangement has yet been reached, however.

The visit of Hon. C. C. Ballantyne, minister of marine and fisheries, to Prince Rupert yesterday marked the tenth anniversary of the visit of Sir Wilfrid Laurier and Sir George P. Graham here to a day.

The usual Friday night dance was held in the Auditorium last night. A large crowd was present and the affair was attended with as much success as ever. Gray's Orchestra provided music to the delight of all.

In the police court this morning before Magistrate McMorde, Axel Lindquist was fined \$50.50 for a breach of the Prohibition Act. There were three cases of drunkenness and the customary fines were imposed.

F. W. Bohler, writing from Kitsumkalum to the secretary of the exhibition, tells that preparations are being made to send a district exhibit to this year's fall fair here in keeping with the records of other years.
