DAWSON, Sept. 10 .- The Nome aeroplanes hopped off from Whitehorse at 2:15 yesterday, flying by way of Glenora on the Stikine River. They will not visit Wrangell owing to the poor landing place and bad weather there. Capt. Street had the supplies taken from Wrangell to Glenora and a landing field prepared.

Three of the planes returned here at 5:30, having encountered bad weather in making the summit. Plane number 4 had not been heard from up to 6 p. m. It may have gone to Wrangell or Glenora. The latter place is ten miles from Telegraph Creek and outside of wire communication.
