Government Fights Republican Courts

New Law Gives Extensive Powers in I eland which are being Used with Effect

BUBLIN, Sept. 11 .- One important provision of the Irish Crimes Bill which was put into effect last month is that which gives power to try civil actions without a jury. It is intended to make short work of the activities of the Sinn Fein Courts which have revolutionized legal business, and largely reduced the Irish Bar to idleness.

The proceedings in criminal matters of Sinn Fein courts are already being dealt with by the police. When the Sinn Feiners arrest a man on a charge of theft or burglary or anything else the police treat the Sinn Feiners' action as a breach of the liberty

assault, tried by courtmartial and sentenced to long terms of imprisonment. The civil trials by the Sinn Feiners are more difficult to deal with, for they can be argued to be merely arbitrations by consent of
