### "MIRACLE MAN" PROVES TO BE SPLENDID PICTURE

Curious Story Told with Wonderful Effect  
 Published originally as a novel in Munsey's Magazine, written by Frank L. Packard and later dramatized by George M. Cohan and presented with phenomenal success on Broadway, the picture, "The Miracle Man," is shown at the Westholme again tonight.  
 As a motion picture, this absorbing story has been hailed by the critics as one of the finest productions ever seen on the screen. With scenes laid in the haunts of criminals in New York's Chinatown, in a little village on the side of a giant mountain and on the shore of a roaring ocean, the opportunity for wonderful photographic effects has been realized to the limit.
