PROVIDE CARGO FOR STEAMERS

Question of Operating Vessel from This Port Discussed by the Board of Trade.

The question of providing cargoes for ships sailing out of this port was discussed at some length at the meeting of the Board of Trade on Saturday afternoon at which C. A. Hayes, vice-president of the Canadian National Railways, was present as well as a number of other traffic men now appointed under the scheme for co-ordination of the two railways.

Another local product that could be shipped was fish, especially canned fish. There was a demand for pink salmon in Australia, these being about ten per cent of the pack. There was also the Alaska pack which might be shipped the same way.
