## Synopsis of Land Act Amendments

Minimum price of first-class land reduced to \$10 an acre, second-class to \$5.50 an acre.

Pre-emption now confined to surveyed lands only.

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is not under lease.

Partnership pre-emptions abolished, but parties of not more than four may apply for adjacent pre-emptions with joint residence, but each making necessary improvements on respective claims.

Pre-emptors must occupy claims for five years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least 1 acre, before receiving Crown Grant.

Where pre-emptor in occupation not less than 2 years, and has made proportionate improvements, or other cause, he may be granted certificate of improvement and transfer his claim.

Records without permanent residence may be issued, provided applicant has made improvements to extent of \$200 per annum and records same each year. Failure to make improvements or record same will operate as forfeiture. This cannot be done in less than 5 years, and improvements of \$100 per acre, including 5 acres of cultivated and improved land of at least 2 years are required.

Pre-emptor holding Crown grant may record another pre-emption, if he requires land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted land.

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesteads, for agricultural purposes, residential and improvement conditions.

For grazing and industrial purposes areas not exceeding 400 acres may be leased by one person or company.

Mill, factory or industrial sites on areas not exceeding 40 acres may be purchased on conditions of payment of stampage.

Natural hay meadow inaccessible by existing roads, and other land, may be purchased on condition of payment of stampage, and one-half of cost of road, not exceeding half of purchase price, is made.

PRE-EMPTORS' FREE GRANT ACT.

The scope of this Act is enlarged to include all persons joining and serving in the British Forces. The time within which the heirs or assigns of a deceased pre-emptor may apply for the land under this Act is extended from three years to five years from the date of such person, as formerly, until one year after the conclusion of the present war. This privilege is also made retroactive.

No fees relating to pre-emptions are due or payable by soldiers on pre-emptions recorded after June 26, 1918. Taxes are remitted for five years.

Provision for return of moneys accrued, due and been paid since August 4, 1914, on account of payments of taxes on soldiers' pre-emptions.

Agreements to purchase land by members of the British Forces, or dependants, acquired directly or indirectly, remitted from settlement to March 31, 1924.

SUB-PURCHASERS OF CROWN LANDS.

Provision made for issuance of Crown grants to sub-purchasers of Crown Lands, acquiring rights from purchasers who failed to complete purchase, involving forfeiture, on fulfillment of conditions of purchase, interest due and taxes paid by members of the British Forces, or dependants, who do not claim whole of original parcel, purchase price due and taxes may be distributed proportionately over whole area. Applications must be made by May 1, 1929.

GRAZING.

Grazing Act, 1919, for systematic development of livestock industry provides for grazing districts and range administration under Commissioner. Annual grazing permits issued based on numbers ranged, priority for established owners. Stock-owners may form Associations for range management. Free, or partially free, permits for cottagers, campers or travellers, up to ten head.
