"Poor old Ireland; it is God's country, but the devil has a mortrage on it at present, and I'm glad to get back to God's newer country, the land of my adoption -Canada." Such was the expression of opinion or Nurse J. B. McNamara, who has just returned from the land of her birth, appalled by the throes of rebellion and turmoil therein. She is an aunt of Mrs. J. F. Maguire of this city and of Duncan McNamara of Vanderhoof. Nurse McNamara left Vancouver on March of this year on a six months' tour of the British Isles, and has much interesting data on industrial and economic conditions prevailing.
