

#### People Want Carnegie Library.

The movement to secure a public library for Prince Rupert went off to a good start last night. There was a large and enthusiastic gathering in the council chamber and the concensus of opinion was that if possible a Carnegie Library should be secured. The feeling everywhere seems to be that the time is ripe for the erection of a substantial library building and that it the Carnegie Commission will erect it, so much the better for this city. If we have to do it ourselves, the building will not be as fine a one as the commission would erect and there will be no permanent guarantee in regard to upkeep.

#### Moderation League Is Being Formed.

A branch of the Moderation League is being formed here. A meeting is to be held tonight for that purpose. The primary object of the league is to defeat the Prohibition Act. They support the proposal that the government act as vendors for the manufacturers, selling to all and sundry, as long as they are over the age of 21 years. That is the idea of moderation as expressed at Vancouver.

So far the suggestion that the league is being financed by the liquor manufacturers has not been proven. The league is carrying on an active propaganda, sending out literature opposing the Prohibition Act. Their great feature, with black headlines is a pamphlet "England Free or England Sober" by the Bishop of Durham in which it is urged that prohibition does not make for temperance as it does not develop self-control. # PREPARE FOR WINTER WORK

Season of Big Activity with Concrete Results about to Commence at Premier Mine

STEWART, Oct. 6 .- A visit to he Premier Mine, said by all the mining experts to be one of the greatest mines in the world would be a revelation even to the most optimistic booster. This properly is just now in the process of changing over from a prospect to the dignity of a real shipping

A mill is being installed on the property which will handle 100 tons of ere a day. This mill embodies all the latest in ore dressing and cyaniding. The company is also putting in, in connection with this mill, a power house which will use water as the generating force. Besides running the mill machinery this power thouse will supply electricity for the mine and all the buildings.

Modern conveniences in the form of hot and cold water baths will also further add to the comfort of the employees at Premier, which has all the ambitions of becoming a town of itself, with hospital, school and post office.
