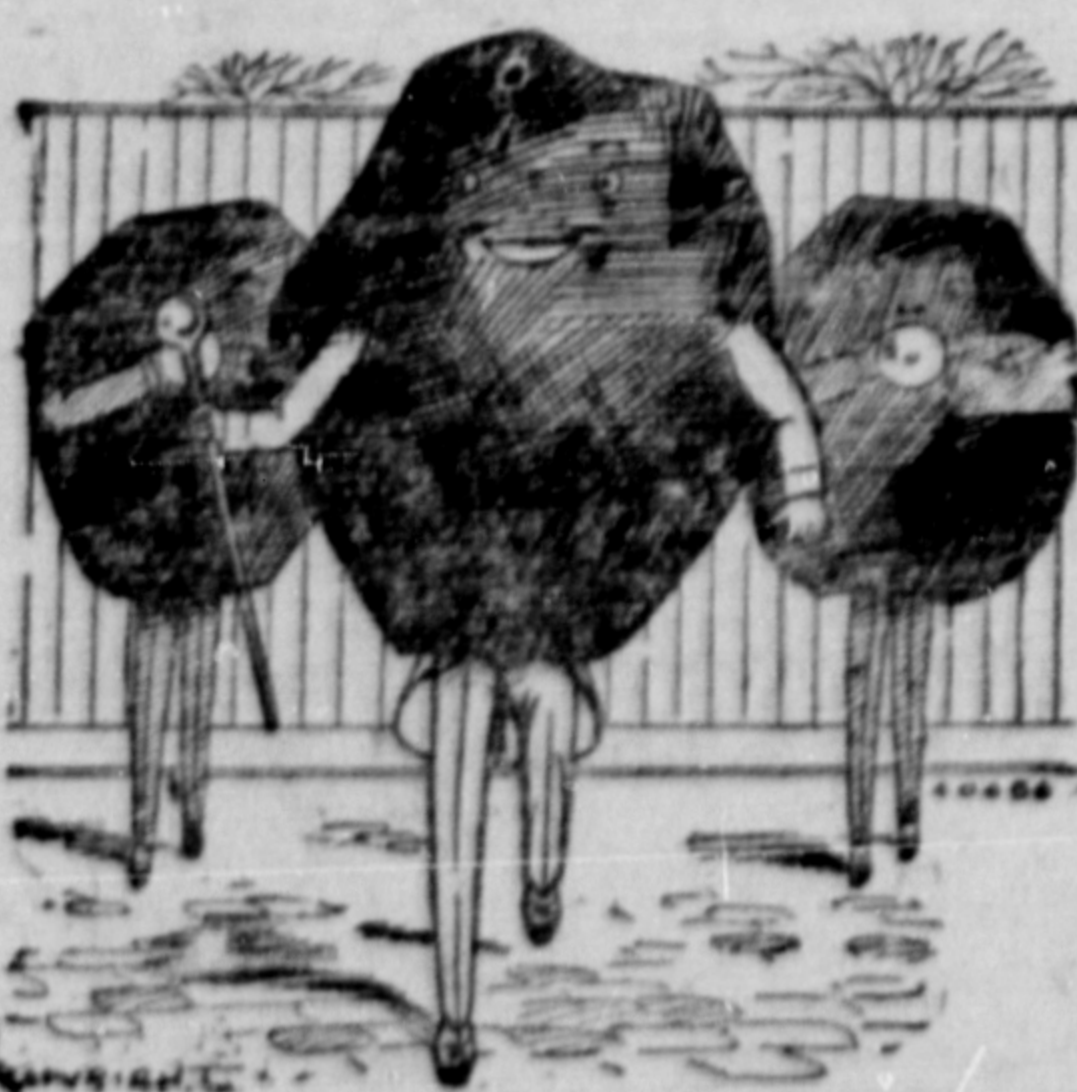

MILLIONS OF TINS

Salmon Cans Used in One Year Placed End to End over 5,000 Miles

OTTAWA, Oct. 9.—When the announcement is made that the pack of salmon on the Canadian Pacific coast for the year 1917 amounted to 1,557,435 cases, the ordinary individual fails to grasp just what that means. That number of cases means 74,756,880 pound tins of salmon which if placed end to end would stretch 5,310 miles or from Moosejaw, Sask., to Vancouver and then to Yokohama, Japan. Laid in two lines they would provide rails for a train almost from Toronto to Vancouver on the Canadian National Railways.

The 1917 pack of Canadian salmon would furnish substantial meals for 614,440 people once each day for a whole year.

In years past the major portion of the salmon pack has gone to the United Kingdom, partly for home consumption and partly for distribution among European countries. There has been a disposition recently, however, to do business direct with the consuming country and this policy in the course of a few years may alter the markets.

GREAT INCREASE REINDEER HERDS

Success of Industry; 1,280, 18 Years Ago, now 200,000 and 100,000 Killed

JUNEAU, Oct. 9.—"If a herd of 1,280 reindeer in the process of 18 years shows a natural increase of 200,000 head, in addition to some 100,000 that have been killed, what will be the natural increase of 200,000 reindeer?" asks Dr. E. W. Nelson. The answer to his question, he said, will give some idea as to the future reindeer industry of Alaska.

Dr. Nelson left for Seattle, concluding a visit that has lasted nearly all summer, during which time he has covered a wide portion of the Territory investigating much of the work of the biological survey of which he is the head. The most important feature of his work was that in connection with the reindeer industry, which he declares is shortly to become important and will not only furnish meat for Alaska, but will also add materially to Alaska's export trade.

Growth Marvellous

The history of the raising of reindeer in Alaska, from its inception to the present time has been little short of marvellous, according to Dr. Nelson. Some 28 years ago the first of these animals were brought from Siberia to Alaska. In the ten years following this number was increased to 1,280. From this comparatively small beginning without addition from outside sources, there has come into being in Alaska herds estimated today to number 200,000 animals. In addition there has been killed, according to those engaged in the industry, some 100,000 reindeer, making the total of the natural increase approximately 300,000. "It staggers the imagination," said Dr. Nelson, "to figure what the natural increase of the present herd will be during the next ten or twenty years."

Frank Carvell has promised that the location of the Prince George station will be determined on his return to Ottawa. Mr. Carvell severely rebuked G. J. Hammond, of the Natural Resources Securities Co., for letters and statements he had directed to the Senate and members of the Opposition scathing the Railway Commission.

Mail matter is to be carried from Vancouver up the P.G.E. to Soda Creek and thence by steamer to Prince George, according to arrangements now being entered into by the Postal Department.

EXAMINATIONS FOR THE POSITION OF ASSISTANT FOREST RANGER.

Object. These examinations are for the purpose of filling present vacancies and to enable candidates to qualify for future vacancies and increases in staff.

Assistant Forest Rangers. Assistant Forest Rangers are employed during the fire season (May to September inclusive) of each year and this period is extended where possible by working on improvements such as trails, etc. An appointment is made each year as long as satisfactory service is given. Promotion to the permanent staff is made by merit and examination as occasion offers. The salary is \$110.00 per month the first year and \$120.00 per month the next year. Travelling expenses are also paid.

Qualifications for Candidates. Candidates must be British subjects resident in British Columbia for at least one year, of good character, good physical condition and with woods experience. They should have experience in fire fighting, possess the ability to organize work and handle men; and have knowledge of the Forest Act.

The examinations are partly written, partly oral and are designed to test the candidates' ability along the above lines. All statements made by applicants as to experience, education and fitness are subject to verification by the examining board. Preference is given to returned soldiers with the necessary qualifications.

THE EXAMINATIONS. The examinations will be held at the places and on the dates named below. Each intending candidate should apply to the District Forester of his district for application forms and for information regarding the hour of the examination and the hour in which it will be held. Application forms should be filled out and mailed back to the District Forester in time to reach him before the date of the examination.
