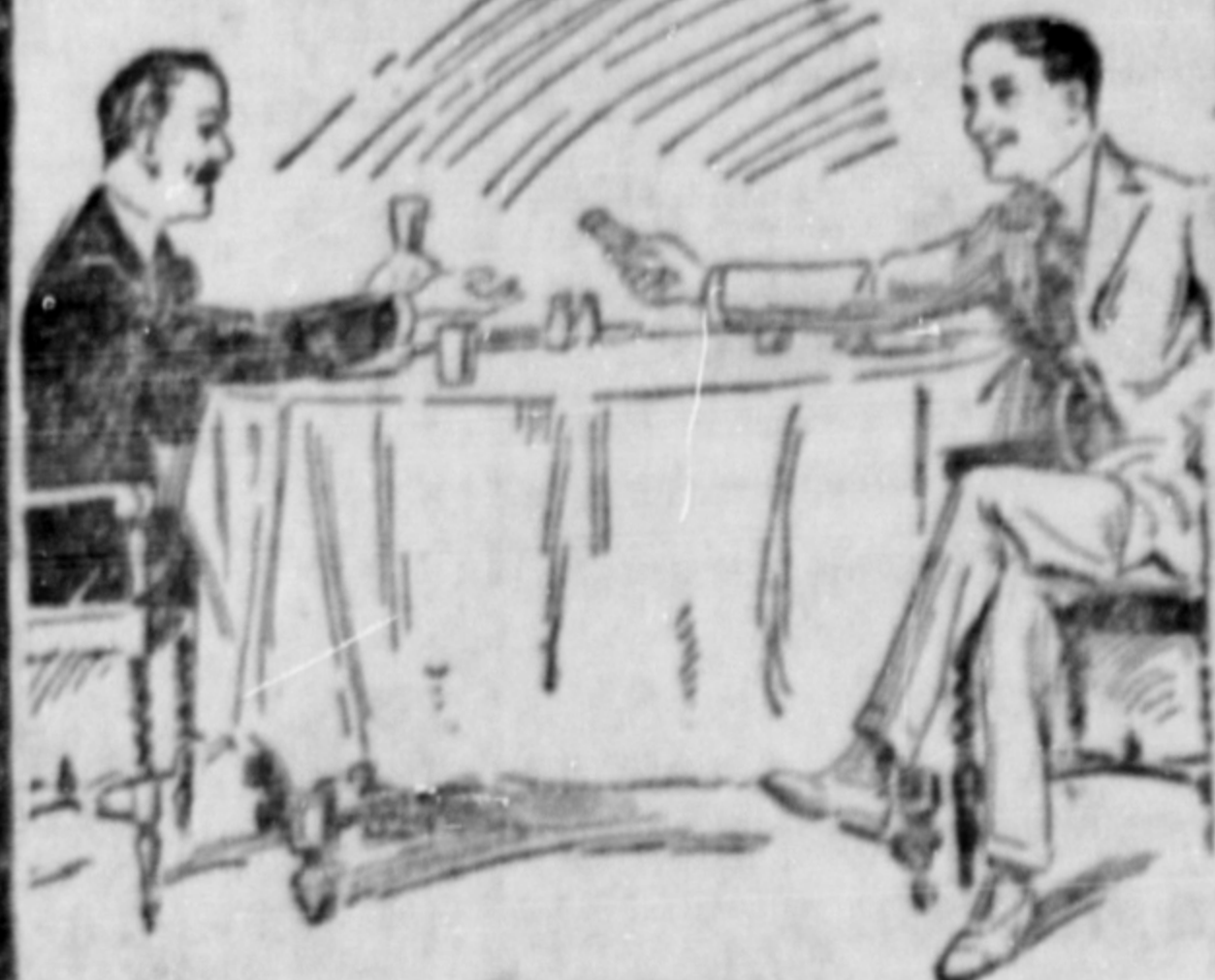

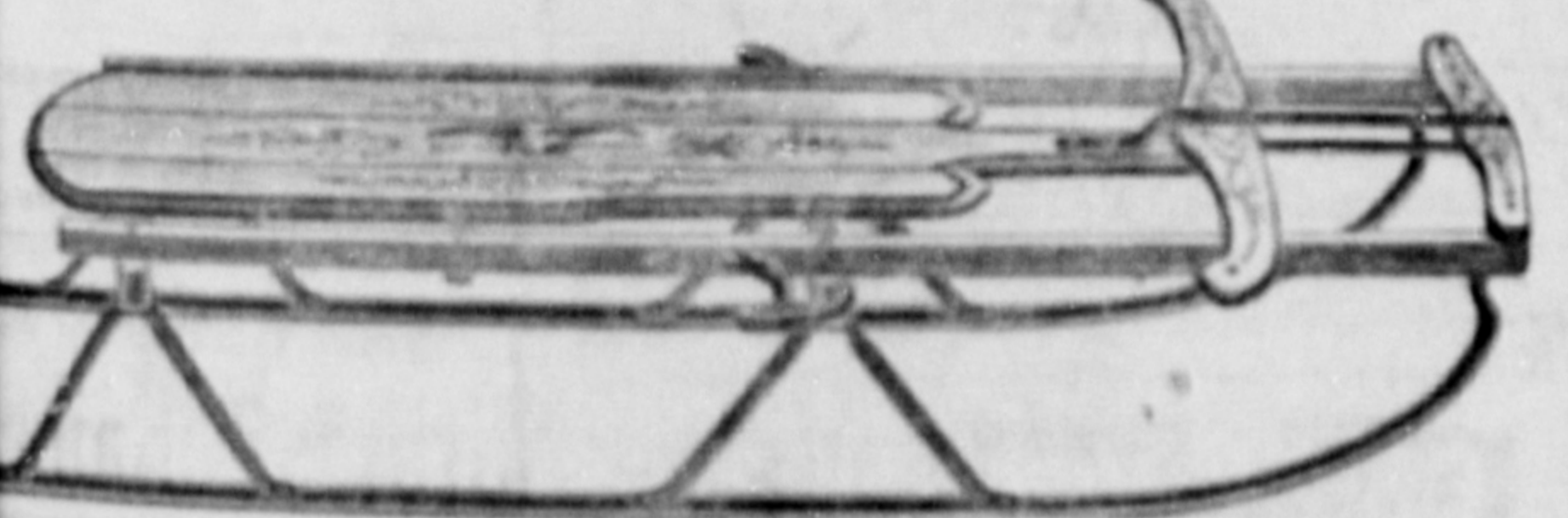

### IN THE LETTER BOX

#### PERSONAL LIBERTY

Editor Daily News—Your editorial of yesterday shows me that I did not get my idea to you and therefore to your readers. Put it this way:

Our forefathers fought for ideals of personal liberty, which Dr. Grant and prohibitionists now deny. Just as an illustration, our early closing bylaw is a piece of democratic tyranny. I have the right to run a store 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The community has no right to interfere with my business unless I injure or threaten to injure someone else. The community has the right to say that I shall not overwork my help, which brings us to the eight hour law.

We have taken the tyrannical method and issue licenses based not on service, but on when my store shall close. This is not right. The community has the power, but might is not right.

The prohibitionists have reached the stage of intolerance preceding witch burning or its modern equivalent. I have seen the operation of some of the vigilance committees in the west. These committees were true democracy, with high ideals of life, liberty, and property at the start. Soon the average member became apathetic. A "ring" secured control and tyranny began. The result was prohibition gone crazy. Our democracy has nearly reached the same stage.

We are none of us so good we can honestly interfere with the private life of our lowest citizen except for the protection of someone else, and those who try for any other reason place themselves still lower. The prohibitionist is a traitor.

## Proclamation of Returning Officer

In the Prince Rupert Electoral District

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given to the Electors of the Electoral District aforesaid, that I have received His Majesty's Writ to me directed, and bearing date the Twentieth day of September, 1920, commanding me to cause the following question, namely:—

### WHICH DO YOU PREFER?

- (1.) The present "Prohibition Act"?
- (2.) An Act to provide for Government Control and Sale in Sealed Packages of Spirituous and Malt Liquors?

to be submitted according to law to the Electors qualified to vote for the election of a member of the Legislative assembly for the Electoral District aforesaid; and, further, that in obedience to the said Writ a poll shall be opened at eight o'clock in the forenoon and shall be closed at seven o'clock in the afternoon on Wednesday, the Twentieth day of October, 1920, for taking and receiving the votes of the said Electors in each polling division of the Electoral District aforesaid at the respective places following:—

#### EXAMINATIONS FOR THE POSITION OF ASSISTANT FOREST RANGER.

Object. These examinations are for the purpose of filling present vacancies and to enable candidates to qualify for future vacancies and increases in staff.

Assistant Forest Rangers. Assistant Forest Rangers are employed during the fire season (May to September inclusive) of each year and this period is extended where possible by working on improvements, such as trails, etc. Re-appointment is made each year as long as satisfactory service is given. Promotion to the permanent staff is made by merit and examination as occasion offers. The salary is \$110.00 per month the first year and \$120.00 per month the next year. Travelling expenses are also paid.

Qualifications for Candidates. Candidates must be British subjects resident in British Columbia for at least one year, of good character, good physical condition and with woods experience. They should have experience in fire fighting; possess the ability to organize work and handle men; and have knowledge of the Forest Act.
