### TAXATION HERE NOT EXCESSIVE

Edmonton, Toronto and Victoria Pay Larger per Capita Tax Than Prince Rupert.

According to authentic figures published recently by the Citizens' Research Institute of Canada and figures obtained at the office of the city treasurer of this city it will be seen that Prince Rupert's per capita taxation compares very favorably with other larger and older cities in Canada. The total taxation levied by the municipality here in 1919, including general taxation and local improvement levy, was \$300,706, which, divided among a population of 8,900, makes the total per capita rate \$37.59.

In computing per capita taxation, the local improvement taxes are not always taken into account but just the general tax. In that case the rate here would be \$29.90 for the total general taxation is \$239,216.
