

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given to the Electors of the Electoral District aforesaid, that I have received His Majesty's Writ to me directed, and bearing date the Twentieth day of September, 1920, commanding me to cause the following question, namely:---

The present "Prohibition Act"?

An Act to provide for Government Control and Sale in Sealed Packages of Spirituous and Malt Liquors?
