

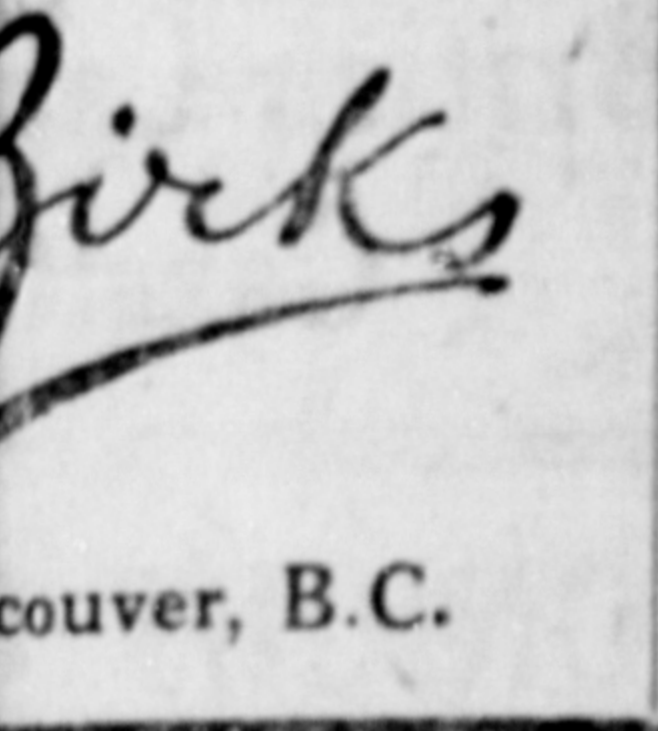

DOWN TO CASES.

Editor Daily News.—Let me tell you of a home, a most devoted mother and a little family of beautiful bright children, a clever capable husband, considerate, affectionate and an excellent provider—an ideal, happy home except when some liberty lover induces this man to exercise his freedom—his "British Liberty"—and then he ceases to be human. Frequently lost for several days, kept by those who would rob him, and when he returns his heavy, unsteady footstep is the signal for the children to run and hide. His faithful wife has never shirked, she has endured abuse, blows and often, has had her life threatened. Yes, this is the price that the moderation league would ask this wife and family to pay that they might have their cocktail. This is the liberty leaguer's ideal of social life, careless disregard for your neighbor's welfare; but scientists tell us that the first effect of alcohol is to destroy the highest moral conception of the individual who drinks it, so we can excuse the lack of human compassion, the absence of sympathy with the unfortunate, and the selfishness herein manifested by the fact that even moderate drinking lessens the normal activity of the physical bases of the higher psychic activities.

Moderate drinking creates a callousness to the suffering of others, so members of the Moderation League, we can forgive you; but on behalf of suffering humanity, on behalf of the security of the home, on behalf of the welfare of the community, your desires must be checked, and your purposes thwarted. You must bow to the common good and when you yourselves have been partakers of that good, you will thank those forces which have led you into the light and sought your own welfare with theirs.

Shall our children be terrorized and our mothers abused that the Moderation League should flourish? Is it not true that we demand freedom in British Columbia homes? That can only be done by preserving what measure of prohibition we now have, and the pressing onward until we have our frontiers closed. This privilege our Premier has promised us if we support the measure of prohibition that we already possess.

GOLF POSSIBLE NEAR THE CITY

Enthusiastic Visitor Wants Prince Rupert Citizens to Lay Out Course.

GOOD FOR BUSINESS AND FOR PLEASURE

"Can't you make a golf links in this neighborhood? You have an open climate all the year round and golf could be played at almost any time. The only difficulty is in securing a course. Nine holes would be plenty. They tell me it is difficult to make the greens in the muskeg, but I should think there would be enough people here interested in the game to get it started soon." That was the statement of an enthusiastic visitor to the city recently. He said he had met a number of former golf enthusiasts here and he wondered why something had not already been done.

"In the southern cities," said this man, "golf is to some extent dropped during the hot weather, and taken up in the spring and autumn and where possible in the winter too. Here, I am told, it is never too hot in the summer to make a tramp over the course enjoyable and except for a few weeks when there is snow on the ground or when there may be a sharp frost, the game would be very attractive both to men and women. If you are ever going to make this a tourist resort you must have a tourist hotel and a golf course. You simply can't get along without it."

The difficulties of the local situation were pointed out to this enthusiast, but he was insistent that where there was a will there was a way and that eventually it would be done so why not now.

EXAMINATIONS FOR THE POSITION OF FOREST RANGERS

OBJECT:
These examinations are for the purpose of filling present vacancies and to enable candidates to qualify for future vacancies and increases in staff.

Forest Ranges:
The salary is \$725.00 per month and field expenses. This is increased to \$140.00 per month second year and \$150.00 per month the third year provided satisfactory service is given and sufficient marks are obtained in the examinations; also there are opportunities for promotion to higher positions. RANGERS who fail to qualify for the higher grades in their first examination may have an opportunity to do so at subsequent ranger examinations.

Qualifications for Candidates.
Candidates must be British subjects not more than forty-five years of age, resident in British Columbia for at least one year; of good character, good physical condition and with woods experience.

They should be familiar with the practical side of logging, timber cruising, surveying, and forest protection; possess a knowledge of the Forest Act; and have ability to organize work and handle men.

The examinations are partly written, partly oral and are designed to test the candidates' ability along the above lines. All statements made by applicants as to experience, education and fitness are subject to verification by the examining board.

Preference is given to returned soldiers with the necessary qualifications.

The examinations will be held at the places and on the dates named below. Each intending candidate should apply to the District Forester of his district for application forms and for information regarding the hour of the examination and the building in which it will be held. Application forms should be filled out and mailed back to the District Forester in time to reach him before the date of the examination.
