Country loses two to three million pounds weekly as result of cessation of work by the miners; Conference continues

LONDON. October 26 .- The miners held a meeting again today to discuss the strike situation. No conclusion was reached at the conference yesterday.

In the House of Commons, the minister of transport said the strike was causing a loss to the railways of between two and three million pounds a week.

The emergency bill providing for protection against public disorder was debated and referred to a committee.
