FRESH EGGS ARE SOARING

Local Stores Asking as High as \$1.20 and Calmly Say will Go No Higher

Local fresh eggs are not to be obtained at the city grocery stores and as high as \$1.20 a dozen is being asked for B.C. Fresh. It seems somewhat reasonable for the merchants to say that they do not think they will go any higher. The demand is very apt to regulate that contingency. Of course the price of eggs is the usual seasonal condition, only they are a little higher. Sugar is still coming down and 2¢ is asked and flour is also loosening up a little.

Fruits are fast disappearing and there is little left but the regular lines and winter apples.

EXAMINATIONS FOR THE POSITION OF
ASSISTANT FOREST RANGER.

Object. These examinations are for the purpose of filling present vacancies and to enable candidates to qualify for future vacancies and increases in staff.

Assistant Forest Rangers. Assistant Forest Rangers are employed during the fire season (May to September inclusive) of each year and this period is extended where possible by work on improvements such as trails, etc. Re-appraisal is given each year for some assistants.

The permanent staff is made up of Assistant Forest Rangers.

Qualifications for Candidates.

Candidates must be British subjects resident in British Columbia for at least one year, and must be in good physical condition and with woods experience.

They should have experience in fire fighting; possess the ability to organize work and handle men; and have knowledge of first aid.

The examinations are partly written, partly oral and are designed to test the candidates' ability along the above lines.

All statements made by applicants as to experience will be subject to verification by the examining board.

Preference is given to returned soldiers with the necessary qualifications.

THE EXAMINATIONS.

The examinations will be held at the places and on the dates named below. Each intending candidate should apply to the District Forester of his district for application forms and for information regarding the examination date and time and the place in which it will be held. Application forms should be filled out and mailed back to the District Forester in time to reach him before the date of the examination.
