Several Heavyweights In Oliver Government.

Besides the minister of lands, whom we all know, there are a number of big men in the Liberal cabinet of which Farmer John Oliver is the head.

In this department Mr. McLean has arranged that, even if schools have only six pupils in attendance, it shall be kept open.

The minister of education has introduced correspondence courses for isolated pupils and for miners; he has arranged that examinations for high school entrance pupils shall not be imperative.

The troublesome question of getting the Doukhobors to send their children to school has been dealt with and overcome.

There have been developments in technical education and in schools for subnormal children as well as for deaf and dumb and blind.

Just recently a teachers' employment bureau has been established without charge to those using it.

A very important step in university development was taken this year when an act was passed giving power to raise money to commence the permanent buildings.

One particular policy as a result of which Prince Rupert has benefited has been the making of grants from the public treasury to aid in building certain permanent schools.

Many Interested In Skating Prospect.

There are a great many young people in town who are interested in the prospect of skating this year at Morse Creek.

Fishermen and Motor Boats.

The question of using motor boats in the salmon fisheries of the Skeena River is a perennial so far as Prince Rupert is concerned.

Drydock Situation Is Regrettable.

GROUNDHOG IS KEY TO MUCH DEVELOPMENT

Two Routes Available With Junction at Seeax and Naas Rivers.

AIYANSH, Nov. 2.—The news published in the Prince Rupert News that the British Government were likely to acquire the Groundhog coal fields, has put fresh heart into the old stand-bys among the settlers in the Naas Valley.

At a glance those who know the Naas Valley and the river can see the line of development most likely to be followed. A line of rails will probably be laid from Groundhog Mountain to Nasaga Gulf at the mouth of the Naas. The isthmus at Iceberg Bay on one side and Nasaga Bay on the other has been, as it were, specially prepared by nature for just such a development.

Below Aiyansh on the other side of the river there opens up the Seeax valley running right through to Terrace. When the railway line reaches the Seeax on its way down river it will branch off to Terrace as well as going down over the lava plain.

This coal could be delivered at Prince Rupert and at the mouth of the Naas by rail at almost the same time. The prospect looks bright for the Seeax settlers and the valley in general and it is hoped that the day will soon come when the lovely valley will be opened up for there is room for much development there.

SITUATION IN OMINECA RACE

Omineca Herald Says There Will Be at Least Four Starters With Possibly More in Election.

"There will apparently be enough candidates for the provincial election in the Omineca constituency," says the Omineca Herald, of New Hazelton. "There will be at least four starters and probably more."

A. M. Manson, the sitting member for Omineca, has consented to again become a candidate and will most likely receive the Liberal nomination at Smithers next Thursday afternoon.

A. J. Prudhomme has already announced his intention to become an independent farmer candidate and has pretty well canvassed the riding. He is banking on getting the farmer vote.

J. S. Kelly of Smithers announces that he is an independent candidate. He already has a committee of twenty-four working for him, including some ladies.

A meeting of the Liberal-Conservative Association is being held in Smithers today to nominate a candidate. The choice will likely fall upon Captain Murray, formerly connected with the Soldiers Settlement Board at Telkwa.

He is now farming just a few miles out of Telkwa.
