NEXT SUMMER UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT WILL PUT IN LIGHT

Buoy Now Going on Perilous Vanderbilt Reef and Beacon Will Be Placed Next Year.

The United States hydrographic survey steamer cedar is installing a buoy on Vanderbilt Reef where two years ago the Princess Sophia sank with all her passengers and crew. Next summer a beacon light will be installed on the reef.

Ever since the Sophia catastrophe there has been strong agitation for the putting in of the light and the dilatoriness of the United States government in promoting safety of passengers and shipping in its waters has been often bitterly condemned.

EXAMINATIONS FOR THE POSITION OF ASSISTANT FOREST RANGER.

Object.

These examinations are for the purpose of filling present vacancies and to enable candidates to qualify for future vacancies and increases in staff.

Assistant Forest Rangers. Assistant Forest Rangers are employed during the fire season (May to September inclusive) of each year and this period is extended where possible by working on improvements, surveys, etc. No appointment is made each year as long as satisfactory service is given. Promotion to the permanent staff is made by merit and examination as vacancies offer.

Salary \$110.00 per month the first year and \$120.00 per month the next year. Travelling expenses are also paid.
