Synopsis of Land Act Amendments

Minimum price of first-class land reduced to \$1 an acre; second-class to \$1.50 an acre.

Pre-emption now confined to surveyed lands only.

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agriculture purposes and which is non-timber land.

Partnership pre-emptions abolished, but parties of not more than four may arrange for adjacent pre-emptions with joint residence, but each making necessary improvements on respective claims.

Pre-emptors must occupy claims for five years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least 1 acre, before receiving Crown Grant.

Where pre-emptor in occupation not less than 1 year, and has made proportionate improvements, he may, because of ill-health, or other cause, be granted intermediate certificate of improvement and transfer his claim.

Records without permanent residence may be issued, provided applicant makes improvements to extent of \$500 per annum and records same each year. Failure to make improvements during same period results as forfeiture. Title cannot be obtained in less than 5 years, and improvements to value of \$150 per acre, including 5 acres cleared and cultivated at residence of at least 2 years are required.

Pre-emptor holding Crown grant may record same pre-emption if he requires land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted land.

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be located as homesteads; title to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions.

For grazing and industrial purposes areas exceeding 50 acres may be leased by one person or company.

Mill, factory or industrial sites on timbered land may be purchased; conditions include payment of stumpage.

Natural hay meadows inaccessible by existing roads may be purchased conditional upon construction of a road to them. Rebate of one-half of cost of road, not exceeding half of purchase price, is made.

PRE-EMPTORS' FREE GRANTS ACT.

The scope of this Act is enlarged to include all persons joining and serving with His Majesty's Forces during the time within which the heirs or devisees of a deceased pre-emptor may apply for title under this Act is extended from one year from the death of such person, as formerly, until one year after the conclusion of the present war. This privilege is also made retroactive.

No fees relating to pre-emptions are due or payable by soldiers on pre-emptions recorded after June 16, 1918. Taxes are remitted for five years.

Provision for retarding money secured, due and been paid since August 4, 1914, on account of payments, fees or taxes on soldiers' pre-emptions.

Interest on agreements to purchase town or city lots held by members of Allied Forces, or dependents, acquired direct or indirect remission from enlistment to March 31, 1920.

SUB-PURCHASERS OF CROWN LANDS.

Provision made for issuance of Crown grants to sub-purchasers of Crown Lands, acquiring rights from purchasers who failed to complete purchases, involving forfeiture, on fulfillment of conditions of purchase, interest and taxes. Where sub-purchasers do not claim whole of original parcel, purchase price due and taxes may be distributed proportionately over whole area. Applications must be made by May 1, 1920.

GRAZING.

Grazing Act, 1919, for systematic development of livestock industry provides for grazing districts and range administration under Commissioner. Annual grazing permits issued based on numbers ranked, priority for established owners. Block-owners may form Associations for range management. Free or partly free permits for settlers, campers or travellers, up to ten head.

CARRUTHERS SHOWS EXTENSIVE DAMAGE

Survey Being Continued at Dry Dock This Afternoon—Capt. Babington Assisted in Salvage.

A preliminary survey of the trawler James Carruthers was held yesterday at the dry dock and the boat is being further examined this afternoon. The exact damage has not yet been ascertained but T. H. Johnson, manager, says that the hull is in bad shape and the job of repairing will be a costly one.

The Prince Rupert Dredging and Salvage Co. had a couple of pumps assisting in salvage operations and Captain Babington remained at the scene of the wreck advising and assisting W. Bell, the port engineer, who was in charge.

HOW TARIFF MAKES LIVING COST HIGH

OTTAWA, Nov. 2.—Sugar at 11 cents a pound in the United States means 19c in Canada. By the time freight and duty are added, as well as importers' profits, the Canadian price is eight cents more than the other side. That is, of course, if the sugar has to be imported. As the Canadian refiners buy in the same market as the United States refiners, they should be able to sell at very nearly the same prices.

URGES MARFISH BE OVERHAULED HERE

The Board of Trade has been communicating with the minister of marine in connection with the overhaul of the fisheries boat Marfish. A communication from the minister states that she is to be taken to New Westminster in order that she may lie in fresh water during the winter. Since that President Parker has further urged that the boat remain here and work be done during the winter.

The Stewart Conservative Club has chosen H. P. Gibson, W. J. Crawford and George Fraser delegates to attend the Conservative convention at Anyox instructed for the nomination of W. C. Ross.

A big she-wolf was caught and killed in one of Charlie Bibeau's traps on the townsite last Sunday.

A small crew is putting the old Portland Canal mill in shape to withstand the winter. It is rumored that the original Bear River mine may operate again next spring.

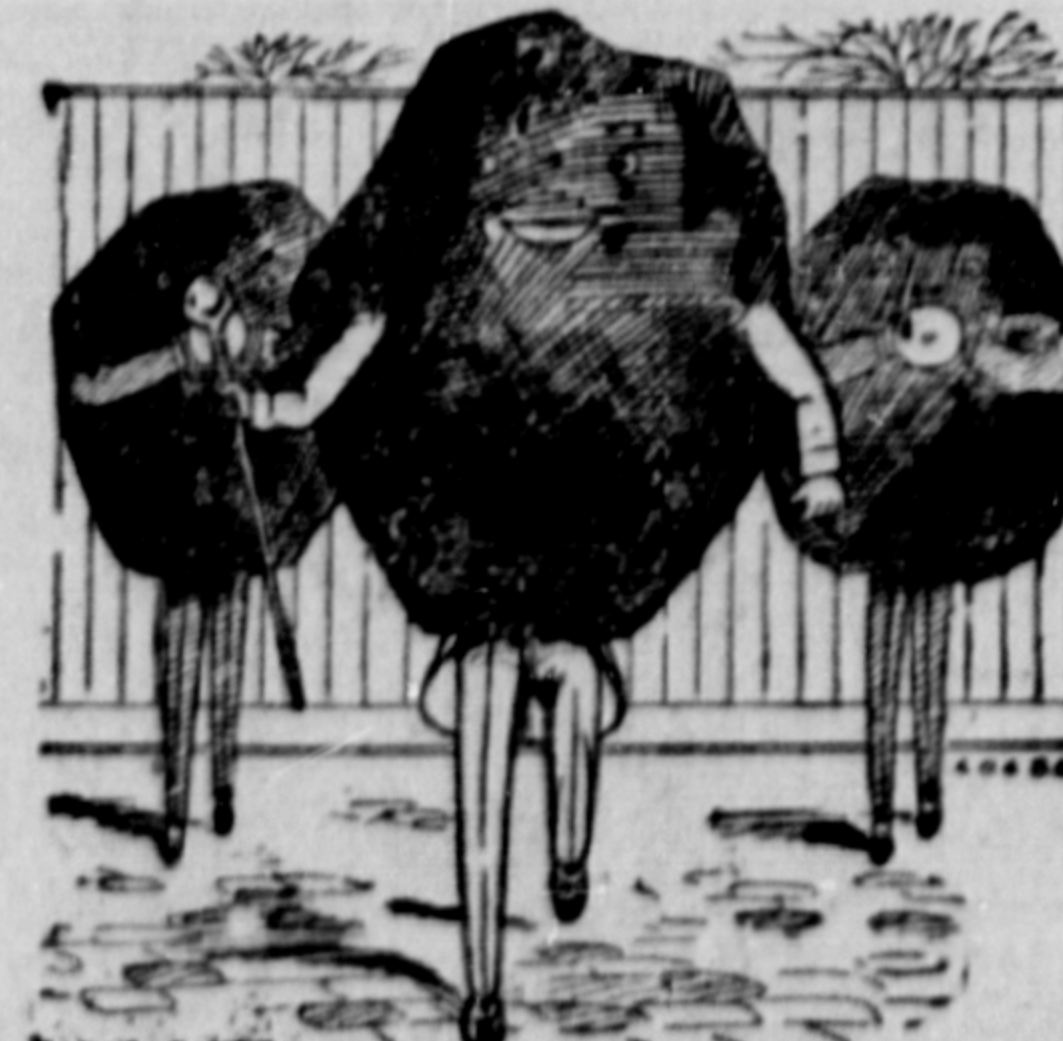

WATER NOTICE. STORAGE.

Take notice that The Maritime Fisheries, Limited, whose address is care of Messrs. Patmore & Fulton, Prince Rupert, B. C., will apply for a licence for storage of 227,690 cubic feet of water out of a mountain stream, also known as Point Nowich Creek, which flows southerly and drains into the Skeena River, about northwest corner of Lot 4445, Range 5, Coast District.

The storage dam will be located at about 100 feet from easterly boundary of Lot 29, Range 5, Coast District.

The capacity of the reservoir to be created is about 227,690 cubic feet, and will flood about 4.240 acres of land. The dam at a point as authorized by conditional water will be diverted from the stream between Nos. 2702, as amended, and will be used for industrial purpose upon the land described as sub-lot 4, District Lot No. 4442, Range 5, Coast District.

The licence applied for is to supplement a right to take and use water as per conditional licence No. 3705, as amended.

This notice is posted on the ground on the 18th day of September, 1920.

A copy of this notice and a application pursuant thereto and to the "Water Act, 1914," will be filed in the office of the Water Recorder at Prince Rupert, B. C., within thirty days after the first appearance of this notice in a local newspaper.

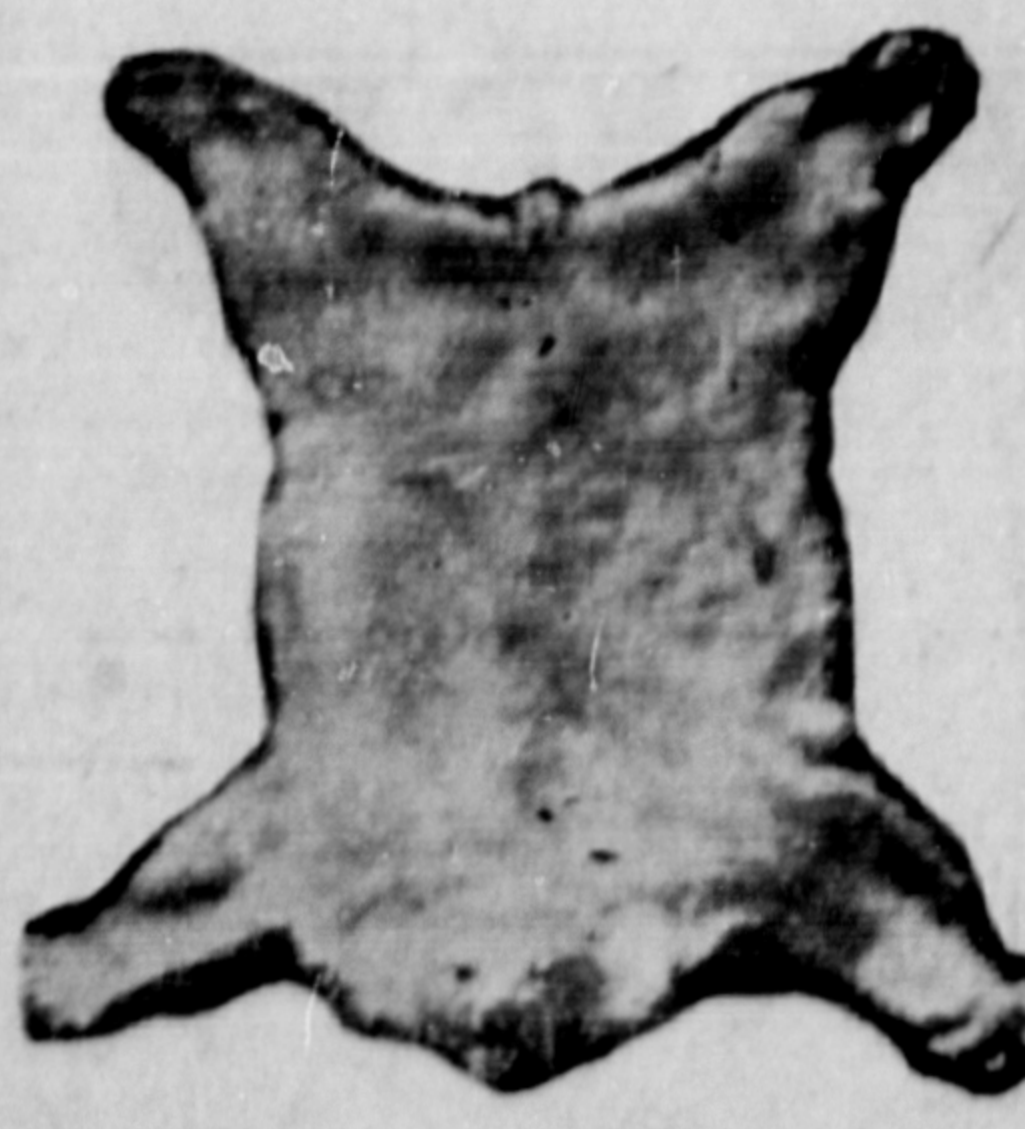
