FUEL SUPPLY HERE AMPLE

G. A. Woodland, Local Manager of Imperial Oil Co., Says Stoppage Will Not Affect Rupert.

The forthcoming suspension of the supply of fuel oil to British Cotumbia from California by the Standard Oil Co. will not affect the port of Prince Rupert to any extent, according to G. A. Woodland, the local manager of the Imperial Oil Co. in speaking to the News yesterday afternoon Mr. Woodland stated that there is already a good supply of fuel oil here and further supplies are coming so that the present source will suffice until next June when the Imperial Oil Co. will be refining its own fuel oil at locols brought direct from the Mexican coast by the company's own boats. The recently announced stoppage of supply will not affect boats or trains operating out of Pacific coast ports.


