Election Notes

A careful estimate of the result of the coming election gives Pattullo a big lead over any of the local candidates, with Formby possibly ahead of Burrough by a few votes for second place and S. M. Newton acting as rear guard.

There is a persistent rumor that O. B. Bush may retire from the fight in Atlin. He has gone south, but it may be to canvass among the electors who are winning outside.

What most people cannot understand is why there should be any opposition to Pattullo, considering the good work he has done and the possibilities for the future. Those who are opposing him are doing so because of personal ambition and not for the good of the province and district.

Further details which arrive from Terrace in regard to Newton's meeting there indicate that it was a frost and that the people there want a man who really stands for something, not one who is ready to take a nomination from the O.B.U. one minute and from the Conservatives the next.

DEVIL INVENTED THE WESLEYAN CRAWL SAYS VICTORIAN

VICTORIA, Nov. 22.—Aid from the pulpits of Victoria churches in combating the popularity of immoral dances alleged to be growing here is advocated by J. B. Greenlaw, who sent a letter to the City Council, endorsing Mayor Porter's crusade against questionable dance halls and offering suggestions.

"If it is to be a knockout blow at the rough element who are running these dancing haunts where temptation and sin are rampant, you should pass a resolution in favor of calling upon the Christian pastors and preachers of this city to get busy along the line of warning the young and foolish against the growing craze of dangerous, suggestive dancing and late hours and late suppers," wrote Mr. Greenlaw.

Ald. Fullerton suggested that the health and morals committee should investigate and take action if considered advisable, but the majority was opposed to action at the present time and ordered the letter filed.

Mr. Greenlaw told of a new dance of a particularly vicious nature which, he said, should be banned at once.

"The devil has invented a new dance and given it a religiously camouflaged name," he said. "It is 'the Wesleyan Crawl,' called after the saintly John Wesley, founder of Methodism. The church people should start a prayer meeting campaign to combat this, and to help you in this business of making Victoria a safe place for impressionable young people to grow up into manhood and womanhood untaunted by the evil influences of immoral pleasures."

ANCHORAGE A CITY

First Mayor and Town Council Elected Recently

Anchorage, on Cook's Inlet, is now an incorporated town and United States Commissioner Davis is the first mayor. When the nation was voting on November 2nd for a President and other officials and Alaska was voting for a delegate to Congress, etc., Anchorage held a special election on the question of incorporating. The Anchorageites decided by the necessary two-thirds vote of 328 to 130 to become a real city and not to be dependent on the Federal Government, through the Alaskan Engineering Commission. Incidentally the voters of the town elected a town council of seven members including Leopold Davis, R. N. Moyer, J. J. Longacre, I. Bayless, D. H. Williams, A. C. Craig and F. L. Reed. By right of receiving the highest vote Leopold Davis, who is United States Commissioner at Anchorage, received the honor to be called the first Mayor of Anchorage.

VICTORIA, Nov. 22.—Herbert T. Yarwood, 27 years of age, was fatally shot near here yesterday. He was duck shooting and the gun went off while he was stepping into a boat.

TO BRING SETTLERS INTO ALBERTA FROM THE UNITED KINGDOM

EDMONTON, Nov. 22.—Having completed plans for the bringing to Alberta and Western Canada of a large number of the best class of settlers from England, Scotland, Wales and Ireland, W. H. Wallace and Richard Aykroyd, both prominent farmers of this district, will sail for the Old Country from Quebec on the Empress of France November 27 next.

Both will spend several months in England, Scotland and Ireland promoting interests in farm and stock raising lands, emphasizing particularly the good agricultural territory of Alberta and the Edmonton district. They will leave well equipped with the co-operation and support of Edmonton business men in their enterprise and their idea will be to bring to Canada men and families who will materially assist in the full development of the land.
