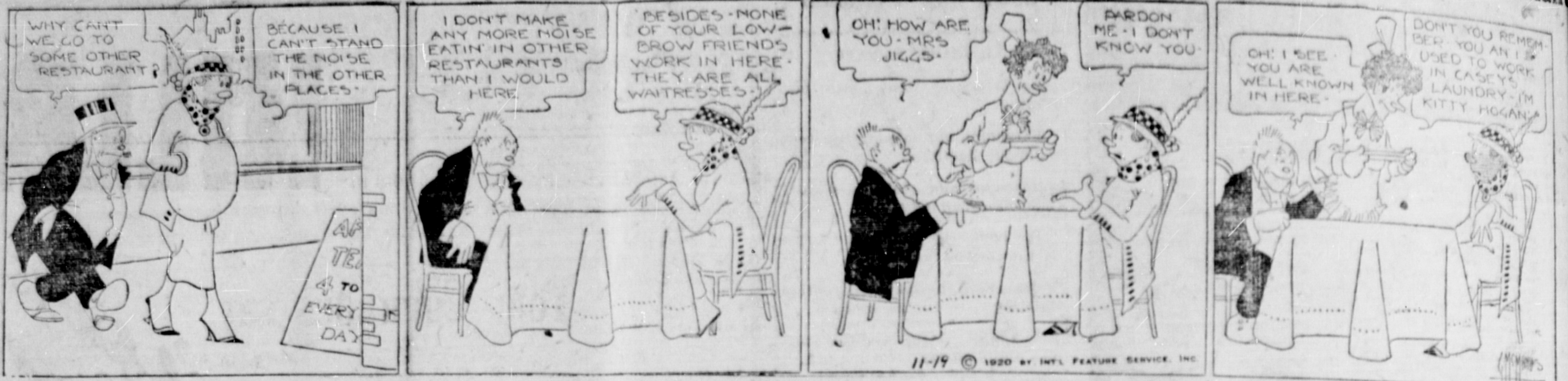

PATTULLO IS ON THE JOB

Wired Protest to Ballantyne Two Weeks Ago—Just Got Reply. SAYS SIDETRACKED ON EVERY OCCASION Before the fisheries boat Marfish was taken south, Hon. T. D. Pattullo added his protest to that of Colonel Peck and others and sent the following telegram to Hon. C. C. Ballantyne, minister of marine and fisheries at Ottawa. 'Prince Rupert, Nov. 13. 'Understand vessel Marfish is to be taken south for repairs. The people here implore you to know why they are compelled to fight every inch of the way for their existence. They put their all here behind a \$250,000,000 undertaking backed by the Government. Now it seems a constant attempt to sidetrack this port at every turn. Surely decent consideration should be shown. If there is one class more than another who should be shown every consideration it is the pioneer.' In reply the minister received the following from Mr. Ballantyne: 'Marfish not being taken south for repairs but to winter in fresh water with other boats without cost to the department. Repairs needed are not extensive and will not be made until spring. Before leaving will Prince Rupert firms interested give me specifications and invited to examine boat so that they could intelligently tender. Repairs will be made in the north if tenders permit.'
