DOUGHNUTS and CRULLERS

DOUGHNUTS! There is nothing more wholesome and delightful than doughnuts or crullers rightly made. Their rich, golden color and appetizing aroma will create an appetite quicker than anything else in the world.

Here are the famous Dr. Price doughnut and cruller recipes:

Doughnuts

- 3 tablespoons shortening
1/2 cup sugar
1 egg
1/2 cup milk
1 teaspoon nutmeg
1 teaspoon salt
2 cups flour
4 teaspoons Dr. Price's Baking Powder

Cream shortening; add sugar and well-beaten egg; stir in milk; add nutmeg, salt, flour and baking powder which have been sifted together and enough additional flour to make dough stiff enough to roll. Roll out on floured board to about 1/8 inch thick; cut out. Fry in deep fat hot enough to brown a piece of bread in 60 seconds. Drain on unglazed paper and sprinkle with powdered sugar.

Afternoon Tea Doughnuts

- 2 eggs
4 tablespoons sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon grated nutmeg
1/2 tablespoons shortening
4 tablespoons milk
2 cups flour
3 teaspoons Dr. Price's Baking Powder

Beat eggs until very light; add sugar, salt, nutmeg and melted shortening; add milk and flour and baking powder which have been sifted together; mix well. Drop by teaspoons into deep hot fat and fry until brown. Drain well on unglazed paper and sprinkle lightly with powdered sugar.

Crullers

- 4 tablespoons shortening
1 cup sugar
2 eggs
2 cups flour
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon salt
3 teaspoons Dr. Price's Baking Powder
1/2 cup milk

Cream shortening; add sugar gradually and beaten eggs; sift together flour, cinnamon, salt and baking powder; add one-half and mix well; add milk and remainder of dry ingredients to make soft dough. Roll out on floured board to about 1/8 inch thick and cut into strips about 4 inches long and 1/2 inch wide; roll in hands and twist each strip and bring ends together. Fry in deep hot fat. Drain and roll in powdered sugar.

ALASKA MINING INSPECTOR PLEASED WITH THE OUTLOOK

After having mushed something over 500 miles through the interior of Alaska with a pack on his back and travelled by every known conveyance, including steam boats, gas boats, Indian canoes and railroad trains, B. D. Stewart, Territorial Inspector of Mines, is back in his office in this city, says the Juneau Empire.

Mr. Stewart said today that he found the mining districts of the interior rather quiet, but that considerable prospecting was going on and that several districts, including the Taelna, Kuskokwim and Kantishna looked very promising. He had nothing but praise for the work being done by the Alaska Road Commission in several districts and said it was doing much to open up country heretofore considered inaccessible.

The whole of the Alaska interior, according to Mr. Stewart, will receive a great boost upon the completion of the Alaska Railroad removing the terrible handicap of inadequate transportation in part, giving the miners a chance to receive supplies over the railroad and the connecting lines of the Government highways.

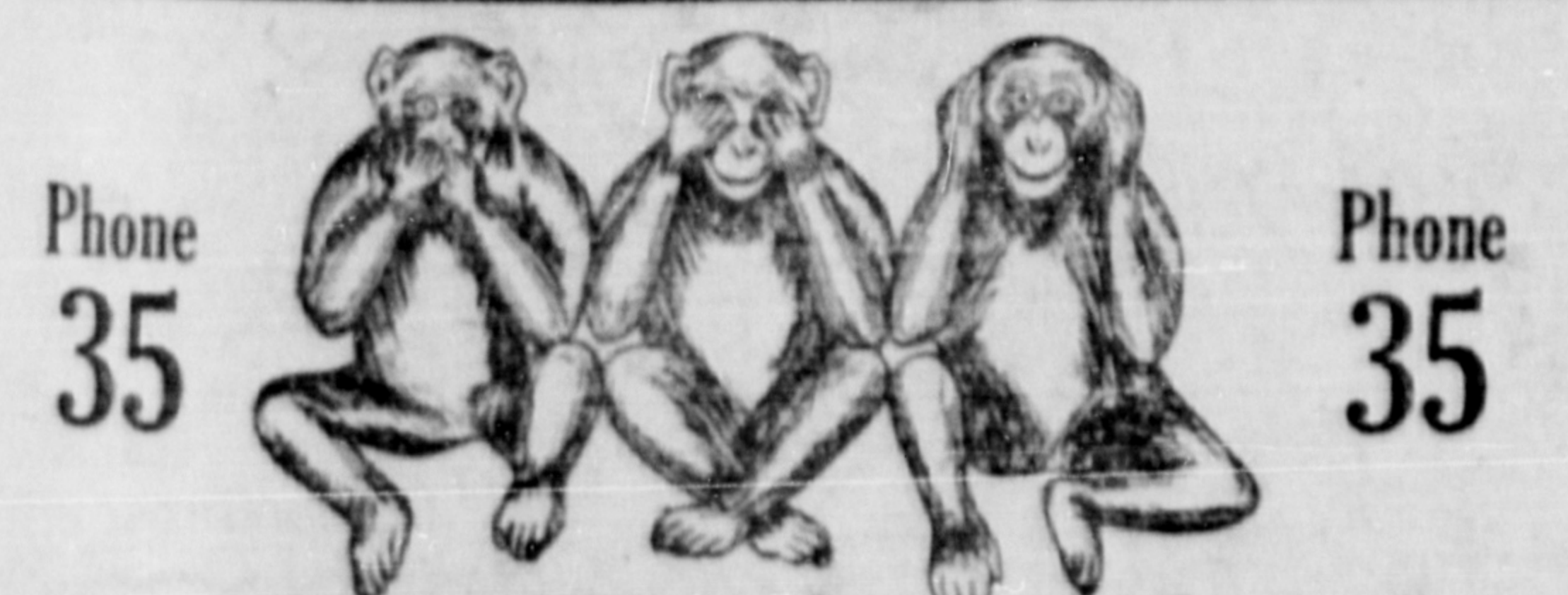
