Socialist Leaders Declare Only Method to Down Bourgeoisie

LONDON, Nov. 30.—Arising out of the split in the German Independent Socialist party, at the Halle Congress, when it was decided by 237 votes to 156 to support the Moscow International, steps have been taken to unite sections of the Left wing in a united Communist party. The "Rote Fahne" has addressed a manifesto to "Comrades of the Communist party," "Comrades of the Independent Socialist party" and "Comrades of the Communist Labor party" asking them all to unite in one Communist party and proclaiming that "the dictatorship of the bourgeoisie can only be overthrown by the iron fist of the proletariat and by the dictatorship of the proletariat." The manifesto is signed not only by the German Communist leaders, but also by the Bolshevik representative Sinovieff and by the leaders of the severed left wing of the Independent Socialists. A provisional joint executive is to be set up under a representative from the executive of the Moscow International.

CONSERVATIVES HELD MEETING

Captain Charles B. Formby Makes First Appearance on Public Platform Here—Beatty Under Fire.

The Conservative meeting held in the Empress Theatre last night in the interests of Captain Formby proved a very unenthusiastic affair. When the meeting started at 8 o'clock the building was well filled, but by 9 o'clock there was a scant handful present for the people had been getting up and leaving in crowds. Doubtless many persons were out with the idea of attending both the Conservative meeting and the Independent affair in the other theatre.

C. H. Orme was the chairman and in opening a wire was read from Col. C. W. Peck at Ottawa telling of the settlement of dry dock affairs. With a few remarks Captain Formby, the candidate, was then introduced. Capt. Formby spoke for about four minutes, telling of his campaign trip and then Mr. Stephens was introduced.

M. M. Stephens Speaks. Mr. Stephens spoke at some length also dealing on the trip and the reception that had been accorded them. The iniquities of the Oliver Government were dealt with but with little effect. Then the Independent candidate and his organization came in for a grueling. A special attack was levelled at J. R. Beatty, secretary of the Conservative Association, alleging that he had bolted to support of the independent candidate after promising Capt. Formby his influence. Telegrams inferring that Newton was the Conservative candidate and that Captain Formby had dropped out had been sent by Mr. Beatty and had caused a number of telegrams of inquiry to come to the organization. The speaker trusted that if Mr. Beatty's resignation as secretary of the Conservative Association had not yet been received it would be asked for. The editor of the News was complimented for the clean campaign conducted.

Old Time Fire. O. H. Nelson made a speech and showed a good deal of his old time fire. He asked for support of Captain Formby to defeat the Oliver Government which was rotten. However, if Formby could not be supported, then Pattullo should be voted for. Better do that than vote for Newton. Mr. Nelson extolled at some length the advantages of straight party government.

Capt. Formby then was heard. He promised legislation to benefit hospitals and children and advocated the throwing open of Cow Bay.

Captain Freeman was called to the platform. In a few words he said that long ago he had pointed out that Pattullo would be a big man. Now he predicted that Capt. Formby would become even greater.

With the singing of the National Anthem the meeting then closed.

FINAL MEETING OF LABORITES

Jack Kavanagh, Orator, Gives His Final Speech in Present Campaign

About three hundred persons attended the final rally for J. H. Burroughs, labor candidate in today's election, at the McIntyre Hall last evening. Fred Shaw was in the chair and the speakers were Jack Kavanagh and J. H. Burroughs.

The class nature of the campaign was touched upon and the development of the franchise was explained. In dealing with the proposition of Hon. T. D. Pattullo to bring in more population, Mr. Kavanagh stated that it was futile to bring in more people where already there were to many for industrial support.

"If I was a farmer," said Mr. Kavanagh, "and I had a herd of 10 mules in a field where there was grass for but 8 and I announced to the mules that in order to solve the feed question I was going to bring in 5 more mules, at what rate of speed would I be kicked out?"
