LENIN TELLS OF HIS AIMS

Anxious to Promote Proletarian Revolution in Western Europe

HELSINGFORS, Dec. 6.—In discussing his policy, Lenin, Premier of Russia, explaining his objects and aims, says:

"I regard the Russian revolution not as an end in itself, but as the first step in a world revolution. The question is 'How are we to promote a proletarian revolution in Western Europe?'"

"We must attack France and Great Britain through their colonies and dependencies—as regards France, by judicious propaganda in Northern Africa, and in the case of Great Britain by similar propaganda in India.

"We are already working powerfully in these two directions. Success will put the world at our feet, and we will smash the Peace of Versailles and replace the rule of the Entente Powers by the rule of the proletariat throughout the world.

"The Germans are, above all, our auxiliaries because their hope of escaping from the penal clauses of the Peace Treaty rests on causing disorder and agitation with a view to profit by the general confusion which will then arise. They seek revenge—we, revolution. For the moment our interests are identical. They will diverge and the Germans will become our enemies only when the question arises whether on the ruins of Old Europe will be founded a new German hegemony or a Communistic Federation."
