CHICAGOFF IS SETTLED

Mine Difficulty is Arranged by Payment of Large Sum

JUNEAU, Dec. 6.—An agreement was reached whereby the Chicagoff Gold Mining Company will pay John Tupela a sum understood to be \$300,000 in settlement of the judgment secured in a suit involving the title of the property being mined by the company. Report has it that the company is paying \$150,000 to Tupela and his attorney now and the other half of the settlement will be made in January.

Tupela's interest in the property was sold to the Chicagoff company through a guardian when Tupela was in an insane asylum. This was several years ago and the consideration for the transaction was \$4,000. After development the claim proved very rich and when Tupela was discharged from the asylum he began proceedings to set aside the former sale.

In the lower court when the matter first came up for trial a finding in favor of the defendant was returned. Upon appeal to the circuit court of appeals this was reversed and judgment was entered, ordering the company to make an accounting to Tupela, but the settlement now made makes an accounting unnecessary.

W. H. Rust of Tacoma who is here conducting the negotiations for the company is one of the principal owners. Another large stockholder is Hugh C. Wallace, ambassador to France. Tupela has always been a poor man and for four years of his life was in the insane asylum at Morningside, but he is now alright again. The property which he owned is only a small portion of that being operated by the Chicagoff Mining Company, which is the largest producer of gold in Alaska.

EFFECT OF CAPTIVITY ON BREEDING FOXES

In an article in the Agricultural Gazette of Canada for November the Veterinary Director General, Dr. Torrance, tells that the main difficulty connected with the raising of foxes in captivity is producing them from disease. It is noticeable instead of giving birth to a litter of four or five at a time as she does when free rarely produces more than two, the average for the farms in Prince Edward Island being at the rate of one and a half. Individual fox ranchers, however, by care and improved methods do succeed in securing an increase of three or even four per pair.

With a view to making success more general, under the direction of Dr. Torrance, research work has been undertaken. Land and equipment have been acquired, two experts from the Health of Animals branch employed, six pairs of foxes from the Island ranches furnished, and a small laboratory fitted up for the studying of the diseases and parasites that affect the animals.
