ALASKA IS NOT A COMPETITOR PULP INDUSTRY

Only One Small Plant Being Installed, but None so far in Operation

LARGE TIMBER AREA BUT IS UNDEVELOPED

Conditions Not Such as to Encourage investors to Come. says Report

WASHINGTON, Dec. 9 .- That the Alaskan pulp and paper industry still has a very long way to go before the far northern state can chaffenge Canada's leadership in that field is aisclosed in the annual report of the Secretary of the Interior just issued. Alaska's forestry resources and their development have been the subject of much discussion within the past few months and it has been predicted on this side of the line that Alaska paper would be on the market in large quantities in competition with the product of Western Canadian mills. The section devoted to Alaska in the Interior Department report shows, however, that while preliminary steps are being taken towards the development of the industry, only one plant has actually been projected to date. This is a small pulp plant which is in process of construction at Port Sneltisham. It is declared it will be ready for the manufacture of pulp by next spring. A prelimilary sale of 100,000,000 feet of timber has been made to this company.

Pulp and Paper

'A number of companies interested in the manufacture of pulp and paper are negotiating for leases of timber, and when the offered leases can be smoothed out, so as to offer satisfactory terms, doubtless several mills will be established," says the report. The leases now offered by the Forest Service cover a period of 30 years, with an allowed twoyear period for construction; the stumpage rate is set for the first five years and a maximum stumpage rate for the following five years. For the remaining fiveyear periods the Forest Service reserves the right to fix the stumpage on prevailing timber rates in the district, but will fix no lexact basis on which the revaluation will be made. This is the stumbling block, and to the igovernor it appears to be a short sighted policy to keep out indusfry for fear that a proper price for future stumpage will not be received.
