In regard to nearby developments it is too early to say anything. It is enough to suggest that something will be heard very near Beament, B. C., to cut 24,200 soon, unless all signs fail. There are big waterpowers nearby which cannot be ignored in the general development of the coast, and from these Prince Rupert is likely to benefit. Anything we can do to induce the development of Falls River would be effort well spent. With a pulp mill at or near Port Essington, and factories at Port Edward, there would be more business doing at Prince Rupert.
