

SUB-CHASERS FOR ALASKA

Recommendations that Eight be Assigned to Northern Waters by U.S.

SEATTLE, Dec. 17.—A recommendation has been made to the Navy Department that eight submarine chasers be assigned to Alaskan waters for aiding the Bureau of Fisheries to enforce regulations, in a report made by Capt. J. M. Ashley, commander of the sub-chasers operating in Alaskan waters during the past season.

Capt. Ashley refers to the depletion of the salmon fishery in Southeastern Alaska and states as reasons the lack of restrictive legislation and practices in violation of present laws, which he divides into three classes—fish piracy, Sunday fishing trips and fishing within spawning streams. He considers the latter to be the principal menace to the industry and that it can be controlled only by greatly increased patrol facilities.

Capt. Ashley recommended that the Navy Department detail a fleet of eight sub-chasers or scout patrol boats and a flagship or tender for patrol work in Southeastern Alaska during the salmon fishing season. In the season of 1920, Lieut. Thompson, commanding sub-chaser 29, rendered valuable assistance to the fishery wardens and at all times heartily co-operated in the bureau's operations. Patrol work can most effectively be carried on if organized jointly by the bureau's representative in charge of the district and the senior officer of the patrol fleet.

HOSPITAL BOARD PROTEST AGAINST QUALIFICATIONS

Consider that Requirements Demanded for Entering University cannot be Followed Here.

At the hospital board meeting last night the report of the house committee protesting the requirements of pupil nurses entering university was adopted. The requirements are considered too stiff for nurses graduating from any hospitals but the large ones in Vancouver or Victoria for they call for the nurse to have graduated from a hospital of at least 100 beds, 75 per cent of which are public and also a good deal of experience in social service work is required.
