In the Letter Box**PARTY GOVERNMENT**

Editor Daily News—This Association has viewed with interest your timely article article on the relation of party to government. There is no doubt that people are beginning to realize that the party system as existing is more autocratic than democratic. They no doubt, as you suggest, have come to the conclusion that the legal profession has too great a representation in the Government and also are now recognizing that this is due to a great extent to the fact that the first essential for a successful legal profession is the ability to talk and persuade. This power is used to advantage at election times as was seen at the last election. They are therefore the pivot of the "party system."

To them come the man with the campaign fund looking for special privilege, to them come the seeker of special privilege and the lobbyist. In fact, all who want favors of any description, and this combination of smooth words, campaign fund and lobby influence enables the swaying of the electorate. You say the electorate chooses, we beg to differ and say the "party" chooses, and the party point is always emphasized by organization, ample campaign funds, and the like, and the result is a foregone conclusion, as long as the "party" itself does not take the bit in its teeth and run away with the wagon. This generally results when the "party" has been so highly organized that even the ample campaign fund of expenditure and promise cannot carry the burden imposed.

Independents a Party

You mention the Independent Political Association as being a "party." True it is a party, but with this essential difference; it is a party of protest against extravagant party promises and the use of money in the shape of campaign funds and selfish appeals to sway the true voice of the electorate. It is a protest against the professional caucuses-led politician—the tool of the lobbyist and the privilege seeker.

The Independent Political Association is no more to be identified with the Conservative party, as you infer, than it is with the Liberal or Socialist party, but it is prepared to co-operate at any time with any party or association who have similar objects in view, which to sum up briefly is "Honest Government."

Such being the case, why all this turmoil about the formation of this new party? According to your statements, and presumably you are speaking for the party you support, namely the Liberal, you are in favor of the same ideals as have actuated the formation of the independent Association, so why the attempt to kill, weaken or destroy a young association because it dares to express itself.

Watches with Interest

The Liberal party is in power at the present time, elected by a minority vote it is true, but under our system elected—all the same, and therefore responsible. They have the opportunity of working for the district effectively and to the point. The Independent Association is watching its course of action as applied to this district with interest. The Liberal party can rely upon the co-operation of this association at all times for good government, but
