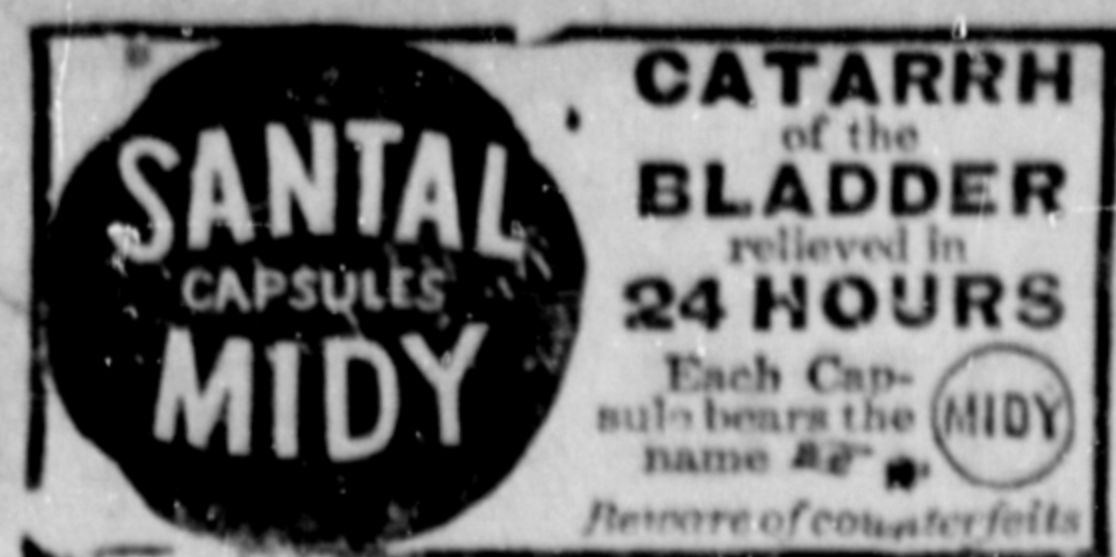

USE AND STORAGE.

TAKE NOTICE that Klamath Pulp and
Paper Company, whose address is 701-2
Vancouver Block, Vancouver, B. C., will
apply for a license to take and use one
thousand second feet and to store five
hundred and six feet of water out of Lower
Inlet River, Lower Inlet, B. C., also known
as Verney Falls, which flows westerly and
drains into Lower Inlet about at its head.
The storage-dam will be located at (1)
Lower Inlet, (2) Upper Lake, (3) Simpson
Lake. The capacity of the reservoir to be
created is about 250,000 acre feet and it
will flood about 4,000 acre feet of land.
The water will be diverted from the stream
at a point about at the head of Lower Inlet
and will be used for power purpose upon
the land described as Kom-o-wa-dan In-
dian Reserve No. 3 and crown lands.

This notice was posted on the ground
on the 23rd day of November, 1920. A
