CHARGES MORE SLAVE TRADING IN AFRICA

LONDON, Dec. 30.—Charges that there has been a resurgence of slave trading practices over wide areas in Angola, a Portuguese possession in West Africa, have been presented to the Assembly of the League of Nations by the Anti-Slavery and Aborigines Protection Society. These charges are contained in the copy of a memorial previously sent to the British government including evidence from Portuguese and other sources concerning alleged slave trading.

The Society appealed to the League of Nations to take cognizance of these charges and, if possible, secure an exhaustive inquiry into the whole system of Portuguese labor in West Africa.
