

Under the terms of the Peace Treaty Germany is compelled to reduce her regular forces to 100,-000 by March 31 and the number of gendarmes must not exceed the number in the police department in the year 1913.

German army in compliance with the treaty obligations is proceeding but at a slower pace than had been originally contemplated owing to the delay in the ratification of the peace treaty.
