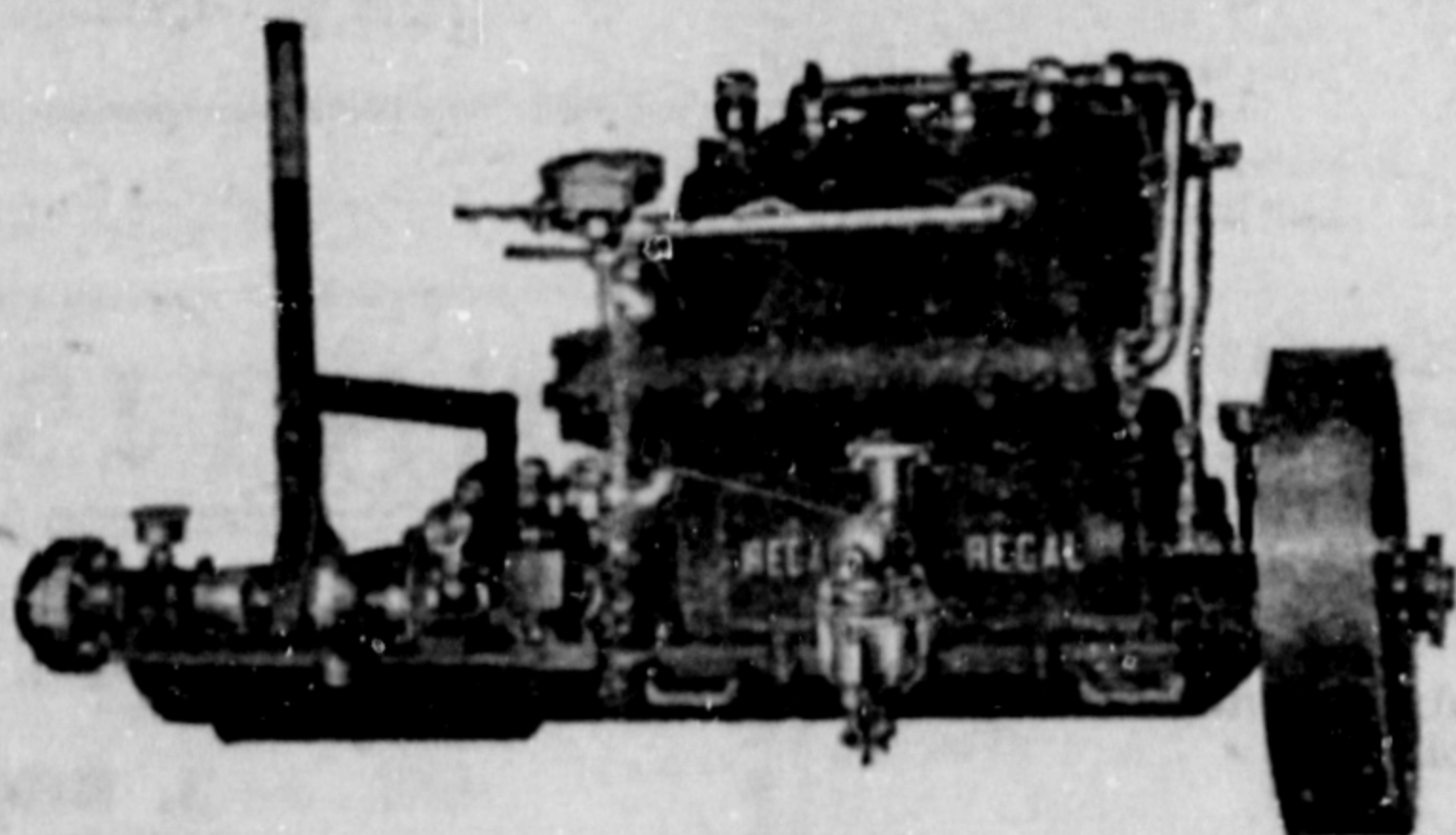

OFFICIAL FIGURES OF IMPORTS AND EXPORTS

The official figures of the imports and exports of the port of Prince Rupert for the fiscal year ending March 31, 1919, have been received from the Bureau of Statistics, Ottawa. The total value of imports for consumption for the year ending March 31, 1919, was \$2,164,727, as compared with \$1,906,906 for the year ending March 31, 1918. For 1919 the exports totalled \$3,400,814 as compared with \$4,242,740 for the corresponding period in 1918.

The decrease in exports is largely made up by the cessation of the shipping of aeroplane spruce for war purposes through this port.
