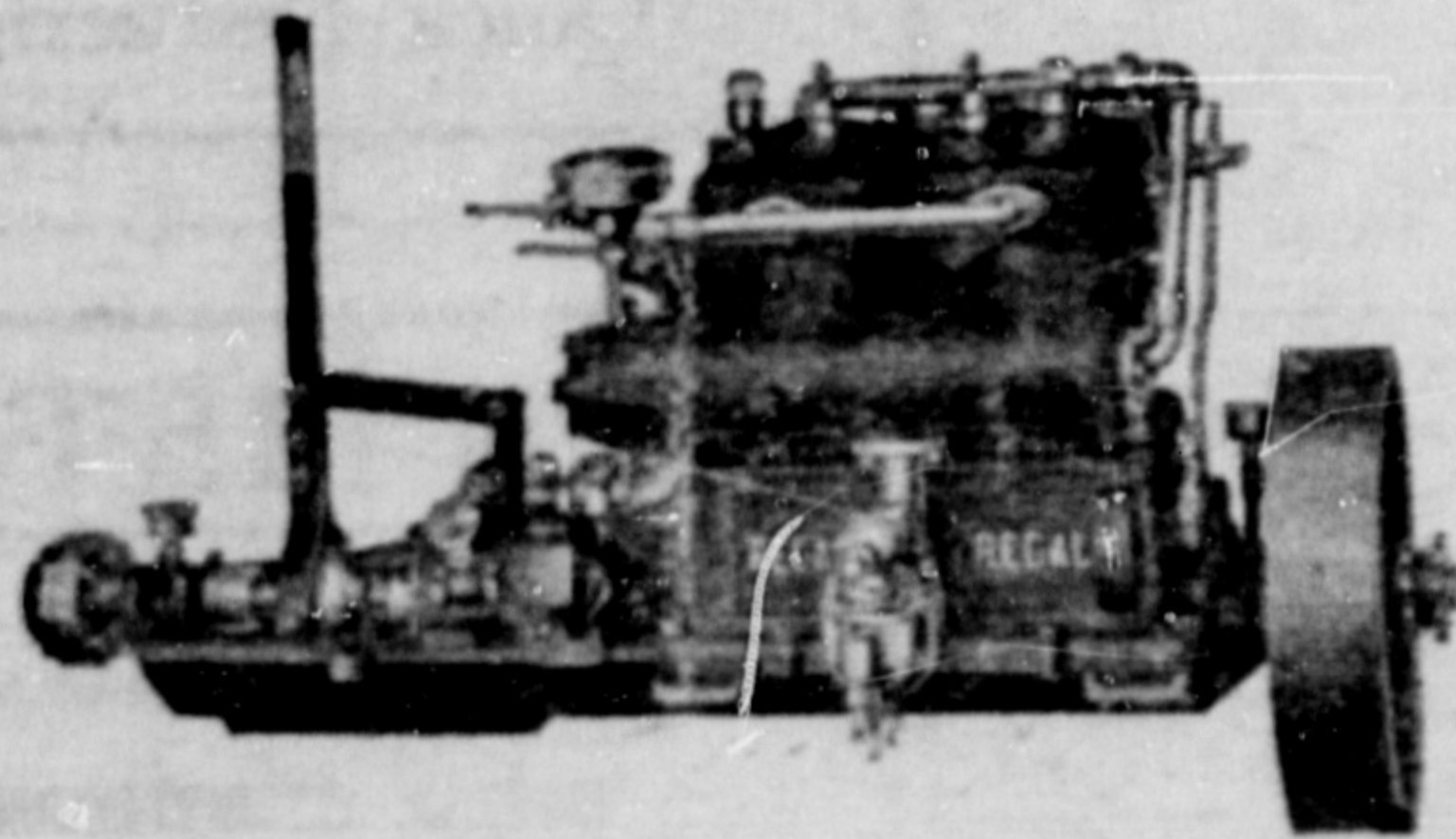

SHIPPERS' LEAGUE COMPLAINT UNJUSTIFIED

The complaint of the Inland Empire Shippers League, that grain returns for the Spokane district made at Portland and Vancouver for this year were prejudicial and discriminatory, has been held unjustified in a tentative report just brought in by the examiners for the Interstate Commerce Commission.

Sport Briefs

More sportsmanship and less temper among some of the local basketball players would make the players and the game in general more popular. Although some people do not mind displays of ill-feeling there are many who leave a game where such is displayed with disgust and the feeling that they do not want to come back. Sportsmen should always remember that athletics consist of demonstrations of competitive skill and not of personal animosity.

Taking a lesson from the loss of thousands of dollars on account of the prevalence of "flu" among the players last season and the final breaking up of the world's series because of the epidemic, Pacific Coast Hockey officials are taking precautions in the interests of the health of the players. Sanitary conditions in the club rooms are being improved and each player is supplied with a small medicine kit of his own. The rooms are to be fumigated once a week and no one is allowed in the dressing rooms between periods unless actually connected with the games. The players will welcome the keeping of visitors out of the dressing rooms as it will be easier for them to rest where the air is fresh and not crowded with people.

Jack Kearns, in accepting the offer of \$400,000 by James Coffroth for a bout between Carpenter and Dempsey in Tijuana, Lower California, made the stipulation that Dempsey should receive half of this figure because Uncle Sam will collect over half of the amount offered for war taxes so it will be some time before Dempsey will be a millionaire unless he practises strict economy.

Tijuana, the place chosen for the bout, is a small city in Lower California, Mexico, just over the American border and 18 miles from San Diego. This place should prove a good location for the fight.
