Canada and the Inter-Church Forward Movement.

There has never been much enthusiasm among Canadians for half measures or for half and half men. The most frequent criticism of our educational system is that it exalts mediocrity and hampers the development of genius in any branch of knowledge or of art.

The establishment of the two great railway systems in the Dominion was due to the desire of Canadians to do a big job as well as possible. Our people are eager and alert to make good. They supported the war in the same way as they work—with nervous intensity and without regard of the cost.
