# FAREWELL SHOT FIRED BY PERRY

Prescribes "Mental Tablets" for  
Patmore and Declares School  
Bylaw Illegal.

Last night's being the last sitting for the present council, Ald. Perry took the opportunity before adjourning to confirm his position on matters pertaining to the School Board and also "prescribe a few tablets for Trustee Patmore's mental indigestion."

"Patmore cannot swerve me and I still maintain this school business has been railroaded. Alderman Kirkpatrick referred me to School Law and I find on closer examination that she doesn't appear to know much about it herself. It plainly says in the School Act that all expenditure, ordinary or extraordinary, shall be submitted to the council. The building of a new school comes under extraordinary expenditure and such expenditure should be segregated into the different classes, building, furnishings, etc., and submitted to the council for each class to be considered and the whole bylaw approved or disapproved. I would like to know how this has been done when the expenditure has never been classified. In view of the fact that the School Board failed to classify the expenditure, it will be forced to come back to the council."
