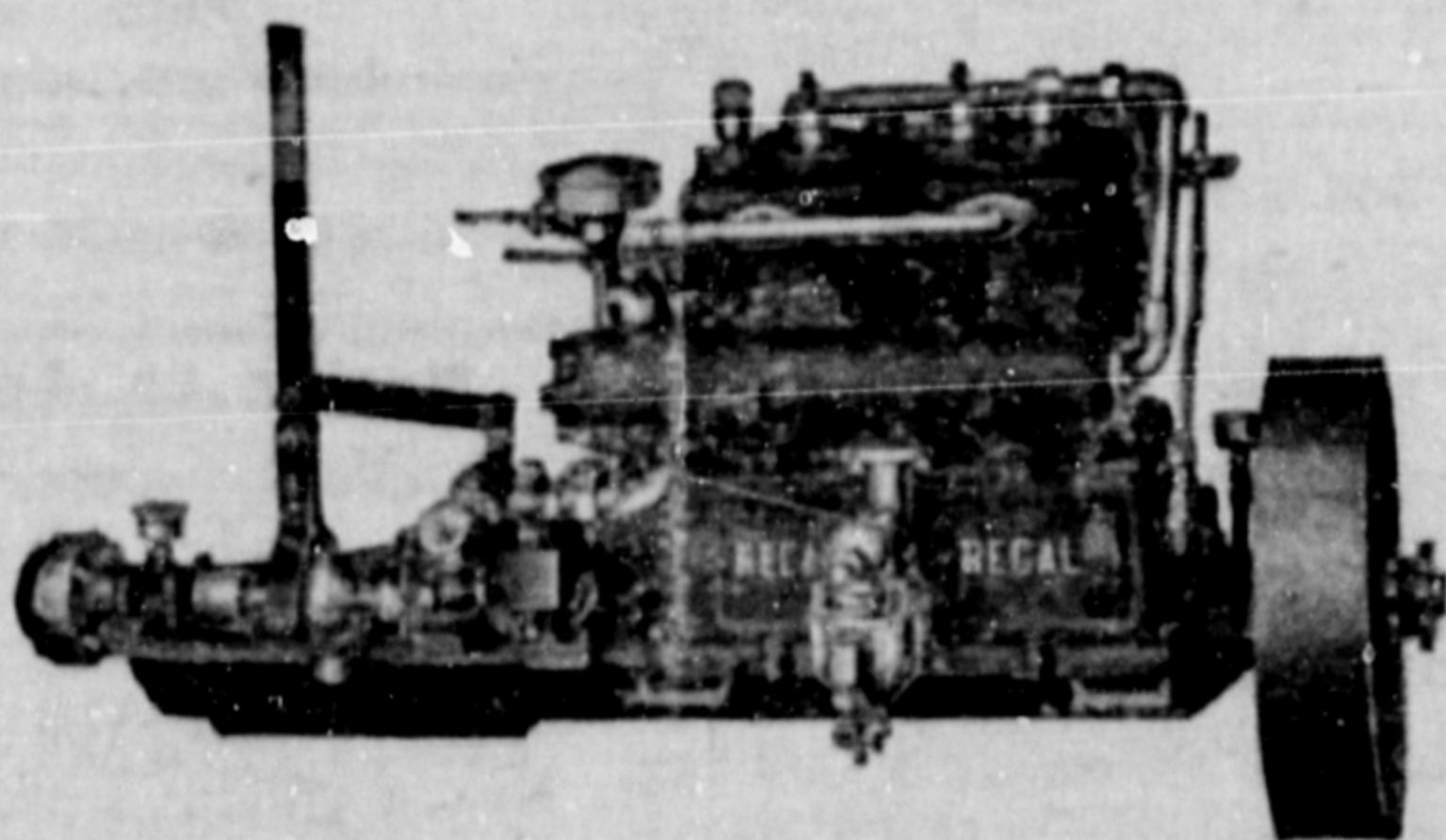

A delegation representing the laborers, helpers and steel workers at the drydock met the Trades and Labor Council last evening to ask the support of that body in their demands for increase of pay. The Council decided to go on record that 55c was not a living wage in this city and that the men were justified in seeking an increase.
