

Channel power proposition and stated that the present mayor had been instrumental in giving away half of the capacity of the present plant and thus brought on an acute power shortage in the city. Regarding the G. T. P. agreement the people knew him well enough to know that he would allow nothing to be put over; by that company. During the coming year he felt that it would be necessary for the city to launch upon a scheme of general permanent improvements to maintain employment in the city. Until the G. T. P. question was settled there would be no work on terminal facilities and the Provincial Government seemed to show no inclination to do any work here yet. Embodied in his permanent scheme would be provision for sewers, roads, hard surface roads and cluster lighting. He favored oria, B. C. the idea of local loans in the flotation of city bonds. 
