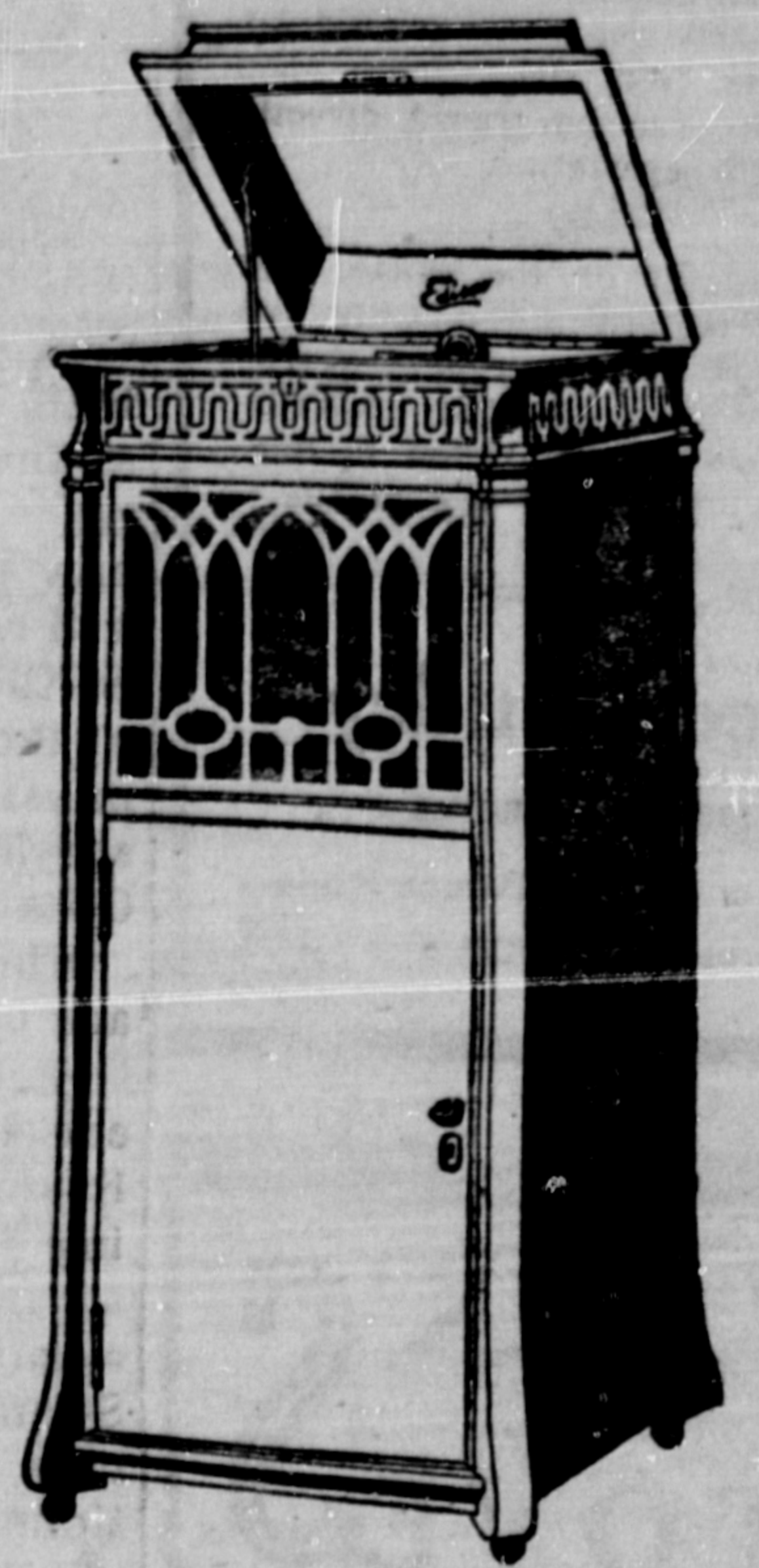
SUGAR TAKES SUDDEN JUMP

Still Scarce on Local Market; Sweet Potatoes Off—Evaporated Fruits.

The most noticeable feature in connection with this week's market report is the advance of sugar; from 15c to 17 1/2c. This commodity still remains as scarce as ever and no immediate relief for the shortage is in sight. The government control limit for the price of sugar is 18c but although they do not look for sugar to rise immediately, local grocers do not take this limit seriously and do not believe it will be effective. Appended to this week's market list is the list of evaporated fruits. Sweet potatoes have disappeared from the local stores during the past week, the season being over.
