REOPEN MILL BUCKLEY BAY SOON AS READY

Fifteen Men Taken to Site to Rebuild Wharf and Prepare For Operations.

George P. Hale, representing the Masset Timber Co. 1919, left last night on the Prince Albert for Buckley Bay with fifteen men and will commence operations on the rebuilding of the wharf at that point.

The Masset Timber Co. 1919 has recently undergone new incorporation and some new directors have been admitted but it is still under the general management of Frank L. Buckley.

The crew which Mr. Hale took over last night will put the wharf in shape for renewed operations there this spring. They will also haul the logs out of the woods and bring them to the mill.

As soon as spring opens up the Buckley Bay mill will commence sawing operations again and will be a big lumber producer. It is over a year since this plant last operated but a considerable quantity of spruce logs are cut near the plant which will now be brought in. Later more woodmen will be put on to cut logs for the mill.

Mr. Hale will spend only a few days at Buckley Bay and will return here as soon as possible on his way south. Mr. Buckley, general manager, will arrive here in two weeks' time. Definite arrangements for the putting in of a pulp mill at Buckley Bay are not complete. It is known, however, that the newly formed company has that object in view.

CAPE TO CAIRO BY AEROPLANE

**Trip Will Be Made in One Week,

The planes will make a number of stops en route and the journey will be made by easy stages.
