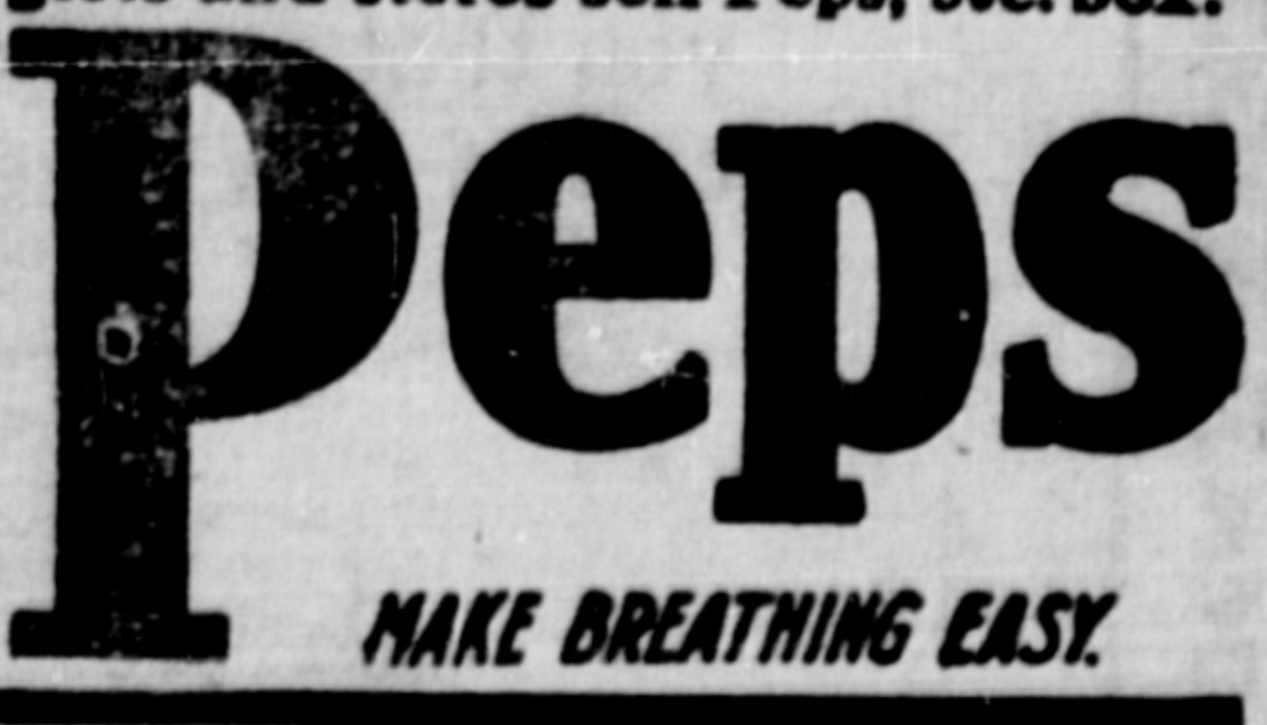

STRIKERS THREATEN TO DESTROY TUNNELS

Simplon Being Protected by Soldiers—Machine Guns on Trains.

GENEVA, Jan. 22.—All Italian international express trains are being held owing to the strike in Italy. Troops are occupying the Simplon tunnel route and no trains are permitted to pass through.

The strikers in Italy have threatened to destroy the Simplon and Mount Cenis tunnels and cripple the railways unless the demands are granted. Soldiers and machine guns are mounted on all locomotives. Trains are moving no mails from Italy to Switzerland and the telegraphs are not working.
