### RUPERT AS SITE OF A STEEL INDUSTRY

Suggestion That This Neighborhood be Location as Ore is Not Far Away.

In connection with the suggestions being made to the Provincial Government the committee presided over by J. B. Roerig suggests as follows:

Vancouver in its eagerness to advance its own interests is sometimes inclined to overlook the possibilities of other parts of the province. In connection with the establishment of a steel works on this coast, Vancouver has put forth its claims. We are of the opinion that it would be well for the Government to keep in mind the fact that we have immense deposits of magnetite iron near-by and what is claimed to be the largest deposit of limonite yet opened in the province on Copper River, not far from the railway. Before any government work is undertaken or assistance granted, we feel that we should certainly be heard from in this connection, for in the vicinity of Prince Rupert as much or more can be offered towards the establishment of a steel works as any other part of the province.
