Opening of the Legislature.

The Legislature opens today at Victoria and by the time this is in print will have gone through the usual formalities preparatory to starting real work on Monday. Not only will a number of new laws be made, and old ones amended, but appropriations will be made for public works during the coming year, and in these appropriations Prince Rupert expects to share.

In addition to the real business of the session opportunity. will be given members to practice speech making and to air their grievances. Nothing is banned. Judging from what is heard from the galleries, members often forget that their real business is legislating, and they give themselves up to plotting and counter plotting in order to gain an advantage and to make their case look well before the country. The public interest is forgotten in the desire for private advantage.

Prince Rupert Well Represented.

Prince Rupert is well represented. Three residents of this city have seats in the House and they are all able men. One is a minister of the crown, one is the party whip, and the other always makes himself heard in the interests of northern and central British Columbia, and takes a prominent part in the work of the committees and other institutions connected with the session. The member for Prince George also is prominent in debate, although he sits on the opposite side of the house from the other members from the north. There is no deadwood from the north just now, as is the case from other parts of the province.

Letter Regarding Premier Mine.

A letter was received yesterday from J. H. Burrough, assistant secretary of the Central Labor Council of the One Big Union Certificate of Indefeasible Title to the said in which he states that the men who were fired from the Premier mine were really on strike. They are still at Stewart where "they have organized a commissary and are prepared to stick it out,"

The letter was handed to the News after ten o'clock yesterday and was therefore too late for publication that day. As the letter has since been published elsewhere we cannot use it.

The letter speaks of "places which it (the Guggenheim concern) curses with its presence." This language is not suitable for publication. A part of the community think that there are other curses just as bad as the presence of the Guggenheims, butit would not be nice of this paper to say so. If we all said just what we thought about everything we saw and heard this would be rather an unpleasant place in which to live.

Unionism is Not The Last Word.

It is well for labor unions to remember that unionism is not the last word in labor movements. The union has been a great factor in improving the condition of the workers, and it still has possibilities. There is a tendency, however, for members of some unions to consider themselves supreme in everything and the date of the service of this notice to give no consideration whatever to the rights of others. Thisshows itself in the language used when speaking of those who do not agree with them. It must be admitted that their opponents are often just as objectionable in their language, but the language is not allowed to be printed in reputable journals and will not appear in the Daily News.

We believe in unionism. The Daily News is a union shop and it works well. Until something better appears, we hope to stick to it.
