URGE STEWART ROADS BUILT

Government Asked to Provide Means of Transportation for Ore From Mines.

"The crying need for government roads in aid of mining must be apparent to any fair-minded person, and we feel that strenuous efforts should be made to carry on extended road work both on the upper Salmon River near Stewart and above the end of the railway at Alice Arm during this year," says a report of the Prince Rupert Board of Trade committee. "We feel that a big, whole-hearted, vigorous road program should be outlined at once and some extended means of transportation provided. In the Portland Canal region last year the Provincial Government did accomplish a much needed improvement in connecting the town of Stewart with the road leading up the Salmon River, but it required one whole season to build this one mile stretch of road. At this rate of progress it would take about six or seven years to complete the road from the Premier mine to the head of the present developments up the valley only six or seven miles away.

Five New Mines.

Above the Premier mine are at least five prospects approaching the proven mine stage of development, all of them have good commercial ore broken and ready for shipment, but they might just as well have their ore broken at the North Pole for all the good it will do them until a means of transportation is provided. These operators, perhaps, are not able to start out very heroically as did the Premier Company and build their own roads, nor should they be required to do so. We realize that it is the policy of the Government to pay for half the cost of roads built in this way to further the development of mines, and as we understand did repay the Premier Company for half the cost of the road in the British Columbia territory through which it traversed, but they were compelled to build the major portion entirely with their own funds.

Basic Industry.

We think that it is not only necessary but essential that immediate steps should be taken to insure the road being built this season up the Salmon River valley to the last developed prospect having ore ready to ship and we think this can and should be done this year if it takes one hundred or one thousand men to do it and no matter what the cost may be, for we feel sure that the ore is there awaiting a means of transportation and it is our patriotic duty to provide this means and thus assist in furthering one of the most important basic industries.

At Alice Arm.

"We think also that a policy equally as extended should be applied to the district at the head of Alice Arm. It is claimed that at least one of the recent discoveries made there will rival the Dolly Varden in importance. We are of the opinion that the province can well do without unnecessary and unessential roads elsewhere in an effort to stimulate the development of our mines.

"We should like to call attention to that sadly neglected and dangerous matter of the wharf approach at Stewart. It appears that there is a controversy between the Dominion government and the Provincial Government as to which one is responsible for the upkeep of this approach. It is very important that this matter be attended to without any further delay, possibly best by the Provincial Government, letting the merits of the dispute be settled afterwards.
