They Will Also Share Same Proportion of Losses in a Bad Year.

PLAN ADOPTED IN BIG KNITTING PLANT

WAKEFIELD, Mass., Jan. 30.--

A plan contemplating the equal division of net profits or net losses annually between the company and its 12,000 employees containing provisions by which the workers may take over control of the business, are announced by Winship, Bolt & Co., owners of the Hart Knitting Machine.

In recent years the employees have received an annual bonus of 15 per cent. and now they have agreed to accept the present plan. The company will credit fifty per cent of the net profits to employees and in a year of unprofitable operations the deficit will be shared equally between the proprietors and the employees.
