E. F. Duby, manager of the Prince Rupert Lumber Co., stated this morning that as he had been assured a supply of power by the city officials he had placed the order for the machinery for the planing and lath mills and the gang saw was purchased two weeks ago.

Work will be commenced on the new units as soon as the material can be assembled. In the meantime construction will be commenced on the other extensions, material for which is already on the ground.

Owing to the favorite change of weather, plans have been made to reopen the mill on February 16, but this is subject to weather conditions being favorable. Unless there is bad weather the saws should be buzzing next month and also the installation of the new plant should go on at the same time. This will help to keep thel town lively and will be one of the harbingers of the busy summer
